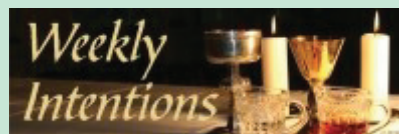

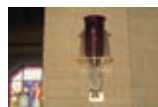

Twenty-first Sunday of Ordinary Time

In this week's Gospel Jesus gives the keys of the Kingdom of Heaven to Peter. But what does that mean? When Jesus asked His disciples who they thought He was, Peter tells Jesus that He is "the Christ, the Son of the Living God." At once Jesus tells him that this enlightenment was from God the Father, and not flesh and blood. Jesus then tells Peter that he will build His Church upon him and He gave him the keys of the Kingdom of God. Jesus told Peter that what he binds on earth shall be bound in Heaven. It appears that Jesus is bestowing on Peter the greatest honor ever given to anyone, and He was! But what does this mean?

We find out what this means later on in the Acts of the Apostles. What happened at the very beginning of the Acts of the Apostles? Pentecost! When the Spirit came upon Peter, he was able to proclaim the Word of God so that all people would understand. No matter what language they spoke, they all heard the same message "Jesus is the Son of God." I believe at that moment Peter was using those keys to open the gates for the thousands of people present. They became aware of exactly who Jesus really was and is. This included all present: people from multiple countries, Jew and non-Jew.

And what is amazing is that when Peter enlightened the people in the crowd, they also had this power to unlock the gates of Heaven for even more people. For us today, by our own actions, by our attendance at Mass, we profess exactly what Peter said in the Gospel. Jesus Christ is the Son of God, the Savior of the World. The gates of the kingdom of God are open to us and to whoever we wish to share this.



Jesus warned us of something very important; beware of the Pharisees and people who act like them. Where Peter had access to the keys and used them to open the door, the Pharisees also have access and can use them to shut themselves and others out! Beware of people like this who don't practice what they preach.

As I am reflecting on this Gospel, I think of a phrase that I believe was used by Bishop Fulton Sheen, "I want to go to heaven and I want all of you to come along with me." When he said this he had full access to the keys and he was opening the gates completely wide for us just like Peter.

Now that the gates are open for us, it is up to us to go in or not to go in. Simply believing that Jesus is the Son of God will do it for us, but I believe our faith commits us to live out and imitate Jesus. I think of Jesus as my brother and we have the same spiritual Father. To enter these gates, we need to take the leap of faith to be alive in Christ and dead to sin, just like Jesus.

The gates of Heaven may be open for us and what I envision is that we enter these gates together hand in hand, waiting for each other so that we can all safely go inside. I believe this is what Jesus wants us to do and that we leave no one behind. This is the same vision as that of Bishop Sheen. Are you ready to go in? Are you ready to unlock the gates for others? Are you ready to allow all your actions to imitate Jesus so that we practice what we preach? I will pray for you, and your family and friends, I pray you do the same for me. God Bless!!!

HAVE YOU BEEN COUNTED? CENSUS COLLECTION ENDING EARLY

The Census Bureau said it will **end the 2020 census count one month early** on September 30th in order to meet the year-end deadline. This could have severe consequences for the vulnerable populations, which have already been adversely affected by the pandemic that has made door-to-door data collection unsafe. Responses are low in Camden County and virtually in every city and state. If the counting time is cut short, communities most in need of resources to improve quality of life and standards of living will be chronically underfunded for the next decade.

WHAT IS THE SEASON OF CREATION?

Christian organizations around the world are celebrating the Season of Creation, the annual celebration of prayer and action for our common home. It starts on 1 September, the Day of Prayer for Creation, and concludes on 4 October, the feast of St. Francis of Assisi, the patron saint of ecology.

The Season of Creation is an ecumenical initiative that has been celebrated since 1989. Pope Francis followed for the Roman Catholic Church in 2015. Pope Francis used powerful words last year to invite all Catholics to take part. "This is the season for *letting our prayer be inspired anew* by closeness to nature . . . to *reflect on our lifestyles . . . for undertaking prophetic actions . . . directing the planet towards life, not death.*"

St. Teresa of Calcutta is joining for the first time this year. Because of the pandemic our actions and prayers will be primarily small and private. Watch the parish bulletin and website for more information soon.

FAITH FORMATION REGISTRATION

We are now registering for St. Teresa’s 2020-21 Faith Formation program. Because of COVID-19 and the uncertainty about educational and social gatherings, our program offerings are changed and will remain fluid, depending upon the evolving situation.

For Kindergarten through 7th grade:

We will offer the traditional weekly model (Sept-May). Families can register for this model with the understanding that the option might be removed if it is deemed inadvisable.

Classroom session will be held in Good Shepherd School if advisable on:

Sundays 9:30-10:45 for grades K through 7th.

Tuesdays 3:30-4:45 for grades 1 through 6th

We will be offering a home school option for grades K through 7. This model will include approximately 2 weekly lessons given by parents and remote sessions with catechists.

8th Grade (2nd year Confirmation Prep):

We will meet two times per month, either remotely, or face to face on Sunday evenings 6:30-8:30.

All children need to be re-registered each year. Families should be registered members of St. Teresa of Calcutta Parish. Please complete the registration information and return it with fees to the Faith Formation office by **August 1**.

We are always in need of catechists and aides to serve our children and keep our program growing and vibrant. We now also need catechists willing to facilitate on line learning. Please contact me if you are interested. All volunteers in contact with children must be background checked and attend a Child Abuse Protection Seminar. The parish will reimburse the costs. The Faith Formation fee will be waived for those who volunteer as catechists or aides.

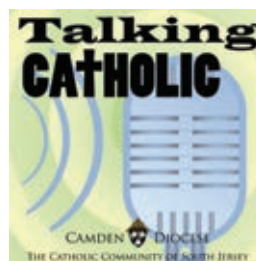
