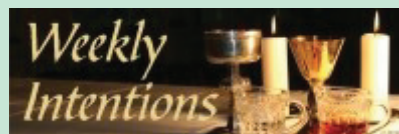

Messengers for God
By Pat Lipperini

It is not often that I pay attention to the Gospel acclamation, but today's passage is really extraordinary: "God was reconciling the world to himself in Christ and entrusting to us the message of reconciliation." Can we just stop for a minute and think about the idea of God trusting *us* with God's most important message? What dignity and capability we must have in God's eyes! And what responsibility we have to each other.

Christianity is most authentically lived when we think of its two directions. Like axes on a graph, it has both a vertical and horizontal dimension. The two pieces of wood on the cross, one stretching to heaven, one spreading wide across the land, illustrate this truth. And Sacred Scripture emphasizes it. Scripture asks us to give God our hearts, to pay attention to God through worship and prayer. Today's psalm is a good example:

*Let us come into his presence with thanksgiving;
let us joyfully sing psalms to him.
Come, let us bow down in worship;
let us kneel before the LORD who made us.
For he is our God,
and we are the people he shepherds, the flock he guides.*

But over and over again, scripture also emphasizes the horizontal dimension of our faith. God asks us to take care of each other and to handle our communal lives with thoughtfulness and reverence. In today's gospel, Jesus gives practical guidance on how to handle disagreements, as though he was well aware of humanity's tendency to escalate tensions. Note that Jesus does not begin with the childish thought that God will simply take away the disagreement if we ask. No, Jesus says, deal with it yourselves. But deal with it always and only within the context of love.

The context of love is what gave the early Christians their identity. St John writes, "By this will all know that you are my disciples, if you love one another" (Jn 13:35). St. Paul tells us that without love, all our efforts are like "a resounding gong or a clashing cymbal" (1 Cor 13:1). The early Christians understood that our love and consideration for each other would be an attractive alternative to the prevailing culture. The patristic theologian Tertullian (d220) imagined non-believers saying: "Look... how they love one another (for they themselves [pagans] hate one another); and how they are ready to die for each other..." The love that Christians shared was not an easy task. It involved hard work, commitment to each other, and a willingness to be guided by the words of Jesus.

*The commandments, "You shall not commit adultery;
you shall not kill; you shall not steal; you shall not covet, "
and whatever other commandment there may be,
are summed up in this saying, namely,
"You shall love your neighbor as yourself."
Love does no evil to the neighbor;
hence, love is the fulfillment of the law.*

But the love they shared made reconciliation possible and workable.



Our faith also teaches us that the context of love goes beyond one's immediate family or faith community. This is where the message of reconciliation becomes much more difficult. The horizontal dimension stretches to embrace all: all races, all religions, all genders, all political affiliations, all human stages of development. This too, is written large in Sacred Scripture, most memorably illustrated in the Parable of the Good Samaritan (Lk 10). And throughout the Church's history, we've seen myriads of saints and holy people responding to God's call, living lives of non-judgmental self-sacrifice for the good of others.

Now, at our moment of history, we are reminded that God has entrusted us with the message of reconciliation. We may be inadequate envoys for so important a task, but who are we to argue with God? Let us look at our own lives and examine the messages we send with our actions and attitudes. St Paul writes, "Owe nothing to anyone, except to love one another" (Rom 13:8). If we can think of love as a debt we owe others, instead of something we may or may not decide to give, perhaps we can better contribute to the reconciliation of the world to God's love and care.

HAVE YOU BEEN COUNTED? CENSUS COLLECTION ENDING EARLY

The Census Bureau said it will **end the 2020 census count one month early** on September 30th in order to meet the year-end deadline. This could have severe consequences for the vulnerable populations, which have already been adversely affected by the pandemic that has made door-to-door data collection unsafe. Responses are low in Camden County and virtually in every city and state. If the counting time is cut short, communities most in need of resources to improve quality of life and standards of living will be chronically underfunded for the next decade.

Voter Information Reminders:

- The deadline for voter registration is October 13, 2020. In New Jersey you are automatically registered to vote if you have applied for a driver's license.
- A voter registration application should be completed if you are new to voting, you have a name or address change, or signature update.
- Ballots will be mailed October 5. Ballots must be mailed back as early as possible given the extra burden on the Post Office. All mail-in ballots must be postmarked by Election Day, November 3, and received by November 10. Voters will also have the option of hand-delivering their ballot to either a drop-off box or polling place.
- There are 5 Drop off boxes in Camden County. They are set in concrete—cannot be removed, are under 24/7 camera security surveillance, and are emptied every day.
- In twenty years, with >250 million ballots, voter fraud was 0.00006%. In other words, there is no evidence of rampant voter fraud. The ballot you receive by mail is encoded with a unique code for you. Your mailed-in ballot is fed through a machine that reads the code and counts your vote.

FAITH FORMATION REGISTRATION

We are now registering for St. Teresa’s 2020-21 Faith Formation program. Because of COVID-19 and the uncertainty about educational and social gatherings, our program offerings are changed and will remain fluid, depending upon the evolving situation.

For Kindergarten through 7th grade:

We will offer the traditional weekly model (Sept-May). Families can register for this model with the understanding that the option might be removed if it is deemed inadvisable.

Classroom session will be held in Good Shepherd School if advisable on:

Sundays 9:30-10:45 for grades K through 7th.

Tuesdays 3:30-4:45 for grades 1 through 6th

We will be offering a home school option for grades K through 7. This model will include approximately 2 weekly lessons given by parents and remote sessions with catechists.

8th Grade (2nd year Confirmation Prep):

We will meet two times per month, either remotely, or face to face on Sunday evenings 6:30-8:30.

All children need to be re-registered each year. Families should be registered members of St. Teresa of Calcutta Parish. Please complete the registration information and return it with fees to the Faith Formation office.

We are always in need of catechists and aides to serve our children and keep our program growing and vibrant. We now also need catechists willing to facilitate on line learning. Please contact me if you are interested. All volunteers in contact with children must be background checked and attend a Child Abuse Protection Seminar. The parish will reimburse the costs. The Faith Formation fee will be waived for those who volunteer as catechists or aides.

PRAYER: SEASONS OF CREATION 2020

Creator of Life, at your word, the Earth brought forth plants yielding seed and trees of every kind bearing fruit. The rivers, mountains, minerals, seas, and forests sustained life. The eyes of all looked to you to satisfy the needs of every living thing. And throughout the time the Earth has sustained life. Through the planetary cycle of days and seasons, renewal and growth, you open your hand to give creatures our food in the proper time.

In your Wisdom, you granted a Sabbath; a blessed time to rest in gratitude for all that you have given; a time to liberate ourselves from vicious consumption; a time to allow the land and all creatures to rest from the burden of production. But these days our living pushes the planet beyond its limits. Our demands for growth, and our never-ending cycle of production and consumption are exhausting our world. The forests are leached, the top-soil erodes, the fields fail, the deserts advance, the seas acidify, the storms intensify. We have not allowed the land to observe her Sabbath, and the Earth is struggling to be renewed.

During this Season of Creation, we ask you to grant us courage to observe a Sabbath for our planet. Strengthen us with the faith to trust in your providence. Inspire us with the creativity to share what we have been given. Teach us to be satisfied with enough. And as we proclaim a Jubilee for the Earth, send your Holy Spirit to renew the face of creation.

In the name of the One who came to proclaim the good news to all creation, Jesus Christ. **AMEN.**
