Registration: We invite all parishioners to register with the Parish. Registration helps us to serve you when issuing letters in connection with sponsorship of Baptism, Confirmation or Matrimony, and for letters of reference. Kindly notify the office if your address changes.

Anointing of the Sick: In case of serious illness or advanced age please call the parish office. For hospital cases, contact the hospital Chaplain.

Pastoral Care: Please call the parish office to have Communion brought to an ill or homebound family member.

Marriage: Couples contemplating marriage in the parish must contact the parish office to meet with a priest to begin the marriage preparation process. This is the first step in planning their wedding and needs to be done one year before the date of the wedding.

Baptisms: Celebrated second and fourth weekends of the month at 11:30 AM in St. John's Church. Contact the Parish Office at least two weeks before the desired date of Baptism to make arrangements. Parents are required to attend a preparation class before the Baptism. Classes are on the last Wednesday of every other month at 7:00 PM in McLaughlin Hall.

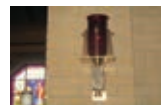

Twenty-fourth Sunday of Ordinary Time: September 13, 2020

In today's Gospel Jesus talks about forgiveness and that if we wish to be forgiven, we must forgive others. Forgiveness is so important. It is a curse and a blessing in the Our Father, a curse for those who do not forgive and a blessing for those who do. But be careful. It is not as easy as just forgiving to forgive.

I think of last week's Gospel. It was the Gospel of when a brother sins against you. It told us to talk to him quietly. If he does not admit his fault, you should take a few other people with you and talk to him. If he still does not admit his fault, take him to the Church. After that if he still does not admit his fault, cut him loose. Some people forgive simply to be done with it; it makes them feel better. Once they forgive, it is no longer an issue, an easy way out. Forgiveness should never be given to make you feel better. It should be given out of love, to make others feel better.

So I am thinking about what we prayed on last week and what Jesus wants us to pray about this week. Let's examine this week's Gospel. A man owes the king a large sum of money and he can't possibly pay him back. After begging and pleading the king lets it go, forgives him completely, and didn't even make him pay a small percentage.

The man then goes after someone who owes him a much smaller amount. He shows him no mercy, and when he begs and pleads he cannot repay it, throws him in jail. When the king finds out about this, he is angry that he did not show the same forgiveness, so the king carts this man off to jail as well. He may have begged forgiveness but he did not mean it. How could he mean it? He turned around and showed no mercy and forgiveness against someone who may have truly meant it.

This is the analogy of how I think of the Our Father, Jesus forgave me for the countless times I messed up and there is no way I can ever repay Him back. All I have to do is show the same mercy to others and I am good. It seems easy enough, but wait, it is not that simple! One, should we just forgive, forgive when no forgiveness is requested? Two, should we forgive when someone asks for forgiveness but does not mean it?

No, the first case is an example of last week's Gospel, when a brother sins against you and refuses to admit his fault. The second case is for this week's Gospel when someone asks for forgiveness but does not mean it.



There is a bit of a gray area, but I look at forgiveness on a much deeper level. People often fall into one of these two categories but there is something more Jesus wants us to do. This is the example Jesus personally lived out for us, his passion and death. When Jesus was crucified, those who killed Him did not admit any wrong doing, but what did Jesus do? He asked his Heavenly Father to forgive them anyway. This is what we are called to do; this is the power of saying the Our Father. Prayer takes forgiveness to a level we cannot begin to comprehend. Through the power of prayer, Jesus can speak to your brother directly in his heart. Jesus will do this if not for your brother's sake but for your sake because he loves you so much and wants you to be happy.

Jesus can bring about true change. He opens the heart, brings about true insight. When Jesus fills your brother's heart, and he asks for forgiveness, it is for real. This is when you should grant the wonderful gift of forgiveness. Never give up praying for anyone. Jesus will never give up on you either. Persevering for months and years is very difficult, but I guarantee it will pay off in the end!

Voter Information Reminders:

- The deadline for voter registration is October 13, 2020. In New Jersey you are automatically registered to vote if you have applied for a driver's license.
- A voter registration application should be completed if you are new to voting, you have a name or address change, or signature update.
- Ballots will be mailed October 5. Ballots must be mailed back as early as possible given the extra burden on the Post Office. All mail-in ballots must be postmarked by Election Day, November 3, and received by November 10. Voters will also have the option of hand-delivering their ballot to either a drop-off box or polling place.
- There are 5 Drop off boxes in Camden County. They are set in concrete—cannot be removed, are under 24/7 camera security surveillance, and are emptied every day.
- In twenty years, with >250 million ballots, voter fraud was 0.00006%. In other words, there is no evidence of rampant voter fraud. The ballot you receive by mail is encoded with a unique code for you. Your mailed-in ballot is fed through a machine that reads the code and counts your vote.

FAITH FORMATION REGISTRATION

We are now registering for St. Teresa’s 2020-21 Faith Formation program. Because of COVID-19 and the uncertainty about educational and social gatherings, our program offerings are changed and will remain fluid, depending upon the evolving situation.

For Kindergarten through 7th grade:

We will offer the traditional weekly model (Sept-May). Families can register for this model with the understanding that the option might be removed if it is deemed inadvisable.

Classroom session will be held in Good Shepherd School if advisable on:

Sundays 9:30-10:45 for grades K through 7th.

Tuesdays 3:30-4:45 for grades 1 through 6th

We will be offering a home school option for grades K through 7. This model will include approximately 2 weekly lessons given by parents and remote sessions with catechists.

8th Grade (2nd year Confirmation Prep):

We will meet two times per month, either remotely, or face to face on Sunday evenings 6:30-8:30.

All children need to be re-registered each year. Families should be registered members of St. Teresa of Calcutta Parish. Please complete the registration information and return it with fees to the Faith Formation office.

We are always in need of catechists and aides to serve our children and keep our program growing and vibrant. We now also need catechists willing to facilitate on line learning. Please contact me if you are interested. All volunteers in contact with children must be background checked and attend a Child Abuse Protection Seminar. The parish will reimburse the costs. The Faith Formation fee will be waived for those who volunteer as catechists or aides.

Over the last six years, the Council has collected nearly 20,000 pounds of clothing and raised nearly \$3,000 for the Pro-Life Fund.

Donated items are sold to thrift-shops and similar businesses. They are NOT ground up or used as rags. Receipts will be available.

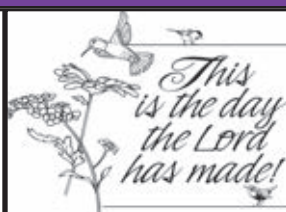
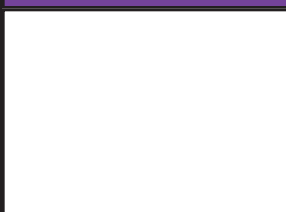
