Welcome to Saint Teresa of Calcutta Parish!

We are pleased to have you share in this celebration of the Eucharist. If you do not have a parish home we invite you to become part of our parish family and become fully involved in our life of prayer, education, service and community.

Registration: We invite all parishioners to register with the Parish. Registration helps us to serve you when issuing letters in connection with sponsorship of Baptism, Confirmation or Matrimony, and for letters of reference. Kindly notify the office if your address changes.

Anointing of the Sick: In case of serious illness or advanced age please call the parish office. For hospital cases, contact the hospital Chaplain.

Pastoral Care: Please call the parish office to have Communion brought to an ill or homebound family member.

Marriage: Couples contemplating marriage in the parish must contact the parish office to meet with a priest to begin the marriage preparation process. This is the first step in planning their wedding and needs to be done one year before the date of the wedding.

Baptisms: Celebrated second and fourth Sundays of the month at 11:30AM in St. John's Church. Contact the Parish Office at least two weeks before the desired date of Baptism to make arrangements. Parents are required to attend a preparation class before the Baptism. Classes are on the last Wednesday of every other month at 7:00 PM in McLaughlin Hall.

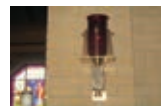

Twenty-fifth Sunday of Ordinary Time: September 20, 2020

Brothers and Sisters,

As we continue to navigate through this time, we are still in a challenging era where the virus is still around, but we believe God continues to watch over us. I want to thank you for all your love and your support for our parish. Even though some of you attend mass virtually, you still financially support our parish community. This is a great gesture that the parish finance council and I greatly appreciate. This is a time of testing for us where so many things are happening in our world, but during all of this, we cannot give up our faith or neglect our community. This is the time our parish community needs your support to survive and to keep being available to serve you and the community. This is a time we need to continue to be spiritually motivated to think about the next generation. Our motivation to keep our faith alive is a great way to help in our fight to keep our Catholic tradition alive. It is also a way to say “NO” to everything that is against our faith and the traditions for which our Forefathers faithfully worked.

This weekend was supposed to be the weekend of our parish festival. Unfortunately, the time does not allow us to celebrate the way we had planned it. It was going to be our first parish festival and feast day. Hopefully, we will have a chance for that celebration next year. I thank the Missionary Disciples’ ministry group, the Parish Council and the Men’s Club for all the effort and the preparation they had already done to make this feast day one of the greatest. We are not giving up on it. We are only putting it on pause for next year.

The gospel today invites us to trust the Lord. His plan is different from our plan. He does whatever he wants, the way he wants and whenever he wants. He continues to show us that his way is not our way and his judgement is different from our judgment. In 2 Peter 3:8 the scriptures tell us that “one day is like a thousand years and a thousand years are like one day”. That depends on how much faith you put in what you must do for the Lord. Saint Teresa of Calcutta said, “It is not how much we do, but how much love we put in the doing. It is not how much we give, but how much love is put in the giving.”

The parable is intended precisely to mean that God does not differentiate us as human beings. In God there is first and no last, no poor and no rich. Have you lost focus on Jesus being primary I your life? Do you feel like you have fallen away somewhat? Do you no longer feel the joy of the Lord in your heart? Its okay God is still with you. Turn now to Him and pray he draws you close. Invite Him to assist you in reprioritizing all that you do. Make doing good actions a priority. God is “good” so sharing goodness is sharing God’s love and ways with others. Joy will flow back into your life. Then your days will not feel like a thousand years and you will have joy and excitement planning to do more “good” things tomorrow. It is fun. Sometimes it’s the smallest, yet kind, gesture that touches people’s hearts. I encourage you to put your faith into all your actions and then you shall experience God’s great love, because when you give you receive.

SANDWICH MAKING

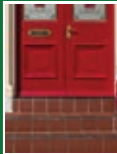
Sandwich making will be handled as **make at home and drop off only**. **This format will be used until further notice**. Please bring your already made sandwiches to

RCIA

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults is the process of welcoming people who want to be full members of the Catholic faith community. This includes those who have never been baptized, those baptized in other Christian denominations, and baptized Catholics who have not received the Sacraments of Eucharist and Confirmation. RCIA is not a “class” but rather a journey of faith. In the company of a group of faith-filled parishioners who serve as the RCIA team and with other people inquiring about the Church, and through experiences of prayer, faith-sharing, instruction, and discussion, you will have the opportunity to grow in your relationship with God as you discover how your faith could be nurtured with the Catholic tradition. FAITH FORMATION REGISTRATION

We are now registering for St. Teresa’s 2020-21 Faith Formation program. Because of COVID-19 and the uncertainty about educational and social gatherings, our program offerings are changed and will remain fluid, depending upon the evolving situation.

For Kindergarten through 7th grade:

We will offer the traditional weekly model (Sept-May). Families can register for this model with the understanding that the option might be removed if it is deemed inadvisable.

Classroom session will be held in Good Shepherd School if advisable on:

Sundays 9:30-10:45 for grades K through 7th.

Tuesdays 3:30-4:45 for grades 1 through 6th

We will be offering a home school option for grades K through 7. This model will include approximately 2 weekly lessons given by parents and remote sessions with catechists.

8th Grade (2nd year Confirmation Prep):

We will meet two times per month, either remotely, or face to face on Sunday evenings 6:30-8:30.

All children need to be re-registered each year. Families should be registered members of St. Teresa of Calcutta Parish. Please complete the registration information and return it with fees to the Faith Formation office.

We are always in need of catechists and aides to serve our children and keep our program growing and vibrant. We now also need catechists willing to facilitate on line learning. Please contact me if you are interested. All volunteers in contact with children must be background checked and attend a Child Abuse Protection Seminar. The parish will reimburse the costs. The Faith Formation fee will be waived for those who volunteer as catechists or aides.

by Robert Fulghum:**

I realized then that I already know most of what's necessary to live a meaningful life—that it isn't all that complicated. I know it. And have known it for a long, long time. Living it—well, that's another matter, yes? Here's my Credo:

ALL I REALLY NEED TO KNOW about how to live and what to do and how to be I learned in kindergarten. Wisdom was not at the top of the graduate-school mountain, but there in the sandpile at Sunday School. These are the things I learned:

- ◆ Share everything.
- ◆ Play fair.
- ◆ Don't hit people.
- ◆ Put things back where you found them.
- ◆ Clean up your own mess.
- ◆ Don't take things that aren't yours.
- ◆ Say you're sorry when you hurt somebody.
- ◆ Wash your hands before you eat.
- ◆ Flush.
- ◆ Warm cookies and cold milk are good for you.
- ◆ Live a balanced life—learn some and think some and draw and paint and sing and dance and play and work every day some.
- ◆ Take a nap every afternoon.
- ◆ When you go out into the world, watch out for traffic, hold hands, and stick together.
