### Welcome to Saint Teresa of Calcutta Parish!

We are pleased to have you share in this celebration of the Eucharist. If you do not have a parish home we invite you to become part of our parish family and become fully involved in our life of prayer, education, service and community.

**Registration:** We invite all parishioners to register with the Parish. Registration helps us to serve you when issuing letters in connection with sponsorship of Baptism, Confirmation or Matrimony, and for letters of reference. Kindly notify the office if your address changes.

**Anointing of the Sick:** In case of serious illness or advanced age please call the parish office. For hospital cases, contact the hospital Chaplain.

**Pastoral Care:** Please call the parish office to have Communion brought to an ill or homebound family member.

**Marriage:** Couples contemplating marriage in the parish must contact the parish office to meet with a priest to begin the marriage preparation process. This is the first step in planning their wedding and needs to be done one year before the date of the wedding.

**Baptisms:** Celebrated second and fourth Sundays of the month at 12:30PM in St. John's Church. Contact the Parish Office at least two weeks before the desired date of Baptism to make arrangements. Parents are required to attend a preparation class before the Baptism. Classes are on the last Wednesday of every other month at 7:00 PM in McLaughlin Hall.

## Twenty-sixth Sunday of Ordinary Time: September 27, 2020



“Which of the two did the will of the Father? Apparently, the question is simple. Last Sunday, with the parable of the worker of the last hour, we were called to be God's faithful servant. This weekend again we are in a vineyard where two sons were asked to work to go do their father's will. The first refuses and ends up going anyway; the second is quick to say yes ... and does nothing. And Jesus asks a seemingly too simple question of the chief priests and elders: "Which of the two has done the will of the Father?"

This gospel invites us to reflect on what type of God's children we are. It is obvious that the question was asked not for the pleasure of who will find the right answer! However, it is to open our eyes on what kind of workers we are in the vineyard of the Lord which is the Church. Our "yes" to the Lord should not have any measure or time or season.

As a priest of this beautiful parish, I can testify that I have many people who are more like the first son. I have experienced so many who do not even wait for the parish to ask them for help, but they are willing to contribute with their time, talents, and treasure. I am blessed to be in a parish where parishioners are willing to come with new ideas and I am always there to support them. What a wonderful way for a pastor to be supported by true brothers and sisters who are ready to help their community with great love!

The parable of the two sons in the gospel for this Sunday liturgy gives us an analogy of two public sinners. The figures that Jesus used in the gospel are not honorable figures, but they are like the first son. There is nothing admirable in being in their position! Based on the gospel, it is not because they are sinners they will be part of the kingdom of the Lord, but because they allow their lives to be transformed by the gospel message that John the Baptist proclaimed to them. It is always time to convert, to come to Christ. We are to refuse the behavior of being a procrastinator. The time is now. Let us continue to open our hearts and minds to the Lord. For it is not those who say “Lord, Lord!” who are pleasing to God, but those who do the WILL of the Father.

The “yes” said to God does not happen overnight. It is the object of a learning, a journey, a conversion, and an asceticism. By warning his listeners of the danger of deluding themselves into their own righteousness and of the hypocrisy of comparing themselves to those whose behavior would be less honorable, Jesus warns us, too, of the risks of delusion and hypocrisy. It is not a question of seeing oneself as the most miserable of sinners or the most unworthy of the Kingdom of God, but out of a morbid taste for guilt or false modesty.

To feel guilty is to withdraw into yourself. To recognize oneself as a sinner is to stand humbly before God. It is a positive attitude because it means trusting in his mercy, waiting for forgiveness and making possible the opening of a path of salvation in a relationship with God, by his Love, and his tenderness. As the psalm says, he restores our dignity, as a Father shows great love to his lost child. Remember: "It's not about how much you do, but how much love you put into what you do that counts." (Saint Mother Teresa)

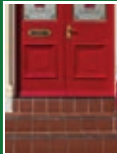

## FAITH FORMATION REGISTRATION

We are now registering for St. Teresa's 2020-21 Faith Formation program. Because of COVID-19 and the uncertainty about educational and social gatherings, our program offerings are changed and will remain fluid, depending upon the evolving situation.

#### For Kindergarten through 7<sup>th</sup> grade:

We will offer the traditional weekly model (Sept-May). Families can register for this model with the understanding that the option might be removed if it is deemed inadvisable.

Classroom session will be held in Good Shepherd School if advisable on:

Sundays 9:30-10:45 for grades K through 7<sup>th</sup>.

Tuesdays 3:30-4:45 for grades 1 through 6<sup>th</sup>

We will be offering a home school option for grades K through 7. This model will include approximately 2 weekly lessons given by parents and remote sessions with catechists.

#### 8<sup>th</sup> Grade (2<sup>nd</sup> year Confirmation Prep):

We will meet two times per month, either remotely, or face to face on Sunday evenings 6:30-8:30.

All children need to be re-registered each year. Families should be registered members of St. Teresa of Calcutta Parish. Please complete the registration information and return it with fees to the Faith Formation office.
