Welcome to Saint Teresa of Calcutta Parish!

We are pleased to have you share in this celebration of the Eucharist. If you do not have a parish home we invite you to become part of our parish family and become fully involved in our life of prayer, education, service and community.

Registration: We invite all parishioners to register with the Parish. Registration helps us to serve you when issuing letters in connection with sponsorship of Baptism, Confirmation or Matrimony, and for letters of reference. Kindly notify the office if your address changes.

Anointing of the Sick: In case of serious illness or advanced age please call the parish office. For hospital cases, contact the hospital Chaplain.

Pastoral Care: Please call the parish office to have Communion brought to an ill or homebound family member.

Marriage: Couples contemplating marriage in the parish must contact the parish office to meet with a priest to begin the marriage preparation process. This is the first step in planning their wedding and needs to be done one year before the date of the wedding.

Baptisms: Celebrated second and fourth Sundays of the month at 12:30PM in St. John's Church. Contact the Parish Office at least two weeks before the desired date of Baptism to make arrangements. Parents are required to attend a preparation class before the Baptism. Classes are on the last Wednesday of every other month at 7:00 PM in McLaughlin Hall.

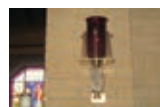

You Are What You Think
By Pat Lipperini

In the cacophony of pre-election rhetoric and ongoing pandemic opinion pieces, it feels like we are drowning in words. Everyone has something to say and so much of it is negative. I don't know about you, but I feel bombarded by the negativity, wearied by the incessant need to blame and criticize. The temptation to bury one's head in the sand is strong, but as Christians living in this world, that is not an option. God so loved this world that God gave us Jesus. We must also love this world and try to make it better, giving ourselves for its healing.

Yet, we are fragile creatures and we need to protect ourselves so that we will not be drained of our joy and peace, like a balloon that slowly loses the air that gave it shape. The beautiful second reading from St. Paul's letter to the Philippians exhorts us to stand firm in our ability to rejoice and spread kindness, even amid a culture seemingly intent on spreading gloom and antagonism. When I read this, I think, sure Paul, easier said than done. But then I read on to the next paragraph and it becomes clear. Paul writes,

Whatever is true,
Whatever is honorable,
Whatever is just,
Whatever is pure,
Whatever is lovely,
Whatever is gracious,
If there is any excellence and if there is anything worthy of praise,
Think about these things.

The answer to the negativity is positivity. This does not mean that we should all turn into Pollyannas, with unreasonable optimism about our times. That is fatuous and unhelpful. No, Paul asks something much more difficult of us, but much more life-giving. Paul asks us to discipline our minds so that we can ponder that which will nourish and sustain our hearts. We need to contemplate, to take in, to absorb the loveliness around us. We need to let that child's smile touch our souls, allow the crackle of the leaves to rekindle happy memories, and truly open ourselves to another's goodness. We need to view artwork, play music, read good literature. We need to see our lives as exquisite moments of God's graciousness. If we work hard, making time and space to contemplate what is true, honorable, just, pure, lovely, and gracious, then those "other things" will not have such power over us. They will be part of our thoughts, but they will not govern our feelings and attitudes.

We are used to saying, "You are what you eat." It is also the case that "You are what you think." In St. Paul's letter to the Romans he urges "Do not conform yourself to this age but be transformed by the renewal of your mind (12:2)." Let us try hard to fight this age's obsessed need to disparage and criticize. Just because the negativity surrounds us, we do not have to swim in it to stay afloat. There is a better way to keep from drowning.

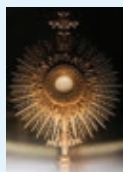
2020-2021 CAMPAIGN :HOUSE OF CHARITY

PUBLIC NOTIFICATION OF DISMISSAL FROM THE CLERICAL STATE

On September 21, 2018, the Holy Father decreed that Mr. John Patrick Connors was dismissed from the clerical state, with all the rights and obligations attached, including of celibacy.

Mr. Connors is also under excommunication for the crime of schism (c. 1364 1 of code of Canon Law) due to his affiliation with a community not in full communion with the Catholic Church, functioning as a priest for the Old Catholic Church.

FAITH FORMATION REGISTRATION

We are now registering for St. Teresa's 2020-21 Faith Formation program. Because of COVID-19 and the uncertainty about educational and social gatherings, our program offerings are changed and will remain fluid, depending upon the evolving situation.

For Kindergarten through 7th grade:

We will offer the traditional weekly model (Sept-May). Families can register for this model with the understanding that the option might be removed if it is deemed inadvisable.

Classroom session will be held in Good Shepherd School if advisable on:

Sundays 9:30-10:45 for grades K through 7th.

Tuesdays 3:30-4:45 for grades 1 through 6th

We will be offering a home school option for grades K through 7. This model will include approximately 2 weekly lessons given by parents and remote sessions with catechists.

8th Grade (2nd year Confirmation Prep):

We will meet two times per month, either remotely, or face to face on Sunday evenings 6:30-8:30.

All children need to be re-registered each year. Families should be registered members of St. Teresa of Calcutta Parish. Please complete the registration information and return it with fees to the Faith Formation office.
