Welcome to Saint Teresa of Calcutta Parish!

Registration: We invite all parishioners to register with the Parish. Registration helps us to serve you when issuing letters in connection with sponsorship of Baptism, Confirmation or Matrimony, and for letters of reference. Kindly notify the office if your address changes.

Anointing of the Sick: In case of serious illness or advanced age please call the parish office. For hospital cases, contact the hospital Chaplain.

Pastoral Care: Please call the parish office to have Communion brought to an ill or homebound family member.

Marriage: Couples contemplating marriage in the parish must contact the parish office to meet with a priest to begin the marriage preparation process. This is the first step in planning their wedding and needs to be done one year before the date of the wedding.

Baptisms: Celebrated second and fourth Sundays of the month at 12:30PM in St. John's Church. Contact the Parish Office at least two weeks before the desired date of Baptism to make arrangements. Parents are required to attend a preparation class before the Baptism. Classes are on the last Wednesday of every other month at 7:00 PM in McLaughlin Hall.

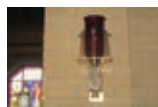

Praise, Our Defense and Offense

Last week I had a great experience through an invitation that I received from Our Lady of Perpetual Help Parish to preach about a subject that I was so happy to preach on: “Praise, Our Defense and Offense”. When I first read the topic, the first thing that came to mind was my soccer skills. As a soccer player for my entire life, I know exactly the roles of defense and offense.

So, I had a chance to do some research to learn about the meaning of praise in our lives and how praise can be an extraordinary action in our prayer. We, as Catholics, do not praise the Lord enough because our nature is to be quiet Christians. However, during our time at mass or at our prayer groups, we have the opportunity to praise the Lord in words and songs. I heard somebody say once that praise is a weapon. I did not realize that until I read about it. Even though I have been doing it for my entire life, I did not put it in this context. From this experience, I came to understand and truly believe that praise is a great weapon to fight any battle that we find ourselves in. From my personal encounter with the Lord, I have learned that praise “silences” the enemy, gives us strength, and lightens our load. Therefore, it is an effective weapon and a great defense.

As Catholic Christians we have a weapon to fight against evil spirits in our world. That means praise can be our offense. When we praise the Lord in words or in songs, we can create an atmosphere for the Holy Spirit to work and move in us so the Lord can answer our prayers. Praise as a weapon might seem unnatural, but it is supernatural. The name of Jesus is higher than anything else that we can encounter in our lives, either disease or financial burden or family situation.

When we give praise and invite the Lord to our situation to heal, to fix our relationship with him and with our brothers and sisters, we acknowledge that he is bigger than what we are facing, and that he can take anything and turn it around for good. When we praise the Lord and put the focus on him, we acknowledge that he is greater. In the book of Samuel, we read: “And whenever the spirit from God came over Saul, David would take a harp and play; Saul would then be soothed; it would do him good and the evil spirit would leave him” (1Samuel 16:23). Praise can silence the enemy. Take some practical steps to use praise as a weapon. When you are going through a battle of any kind, let praise always be your first weapon of choice.

There are many ways that you can use praise as a weapon. Listen to praise music by listening to the music about what you want to praise the Lord for, such as, a way maker, rescuer, helper, wisdom-giver, comforter etc. During the praising time, make sure that you focus on one characteristic of the Lord during that moment so your praising time can be effective. You can also read the scripture by looking up passages that fit the present moment of your situation.

In our Church, we started a new ministry. We invite everyone to focus on the aspect of prayer as a parish. We usually pray for ourselves, for our friends and family. However, seldom in our personal prayer time do we pray for our parish. As you read in last week’s bulletin, we started the parish intercessory prayer group where members of the parish are encouraged to spend one hour a week to pray for the intention of the week.

Here is this week’s intention created by the ministry of the Lectors:

Let us pray for the leaders of our Church: Pope Francis, Bishop Sullivan, priests, deacons, and especially for Father Yvans, Deacon Leo, and all those in our parish who are leaders in their ministries. Give them wisdom and strength as they carry the message of Jesus to our parishioners. May we generously join them as they continue to serve our parish. Lord, bless and guide our leaders as they continue to serve our parish. **Inspire more of our parishioners to join them in service.**

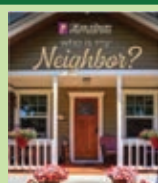

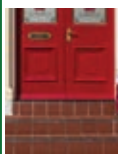

RCIA

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults is the process of welcoming people who want to be full members of the Catholic faith community. What Is an Intercessory Prayer Ministry?

This is a group of people who devote specific time to pray for the needs of others in the parish. As part of the Intercessory Prayer group, each of our parish ministries will be assigned a week and create an intention for a specific need of our parish.

In order to give structure to this hour, these are the areas that we will concentrate on praying for: Church leadership, the world, our parish ministries, parish missions, parish pastoral planning, and parish spiritual events.

How This Ministry Will Work

During the year, each ministry will be assigned a week to participate in the Intercessory Prayer devotion along with the Intercessory Prayer Ministry and the entire parish as follows:

- Each ministry will be assigned a week.
- The ministry will develop prayer intentions for the week and submit them to the parish office two weeks prior to the beginning of their assigned week. Submit intentions to Stephanie at scampbell@stteresaofcalcuttanj.org.
- They will be published in the bulletin for that week, on the parish web site, and also on the parish's Facebook Page.
- Each member of the ministry is asked to spend an hour in prayer during the week for those intentions.
- If possible, the hour of prayer should be spent with the Blessed Sacrament which is exposed Monday through Friday for an hour after the conclusion of the 9:00am mass (from approximately 9:30 until 10:30).
- If they are unable to attend in person, the members of the ministry are asked to spend an hour in prayer for the intentions sometime during that ministry's week. Choose a place and time that works for you. The exposition will be streamed on Facebook Live if this is convenient for any of the members of your ministry.
