Welcome to Saint Teresa of Calcutta Parish!

We are pleased to have you share in this celebration of the Eucharist. If you do not have a parish home we invite you to become part of our parish family and become fully involved in our life of prayer, education, service and community.

Registration: We invite all parishioners to register with the Parish. Registration helps us to serve you when issuing letters in connection with sponsorship of Baptism, Confirmation or Matrimony, and for letters of reference. Kindly notify the office if your address changes.

Anointing of the Sick: In case of serious illness or advanced age please call the parish office. For hospital cases, contact the hospital Chaplain.

Pastoral Care: Please call the parish office to have Communion brought to an ill or homebound family member.

Marriage: Couples contemplating marriage in the parish must contact the parish office to meet with a priest to begin the marriage preparation process. This is the first step in planning their wedding and needs to be done one year before the date of the wedding.

Baptisms: Celebrated second and fourth Sundays of the month at 12:30PM in St. John's Church. Contact the Parish Office at least two weeks before the desired date of Baptism to make arrangements. Parents are required to attend a preparation class before the Baptism. Classes are on the last Wednesday of every other month at 7:00 PM in McLaughlin Hall.

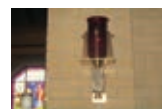

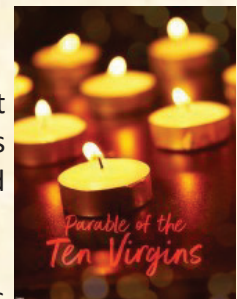
In today's Gospel Jesus tells us to be vigilant, because we do not know when He will be coming. All we know is that He will come back in all His glory. He compares His triumphant return to a bridegroom arriving to take his bride to his father's house. To understand this Gospel we need to know what an ancient Jewish wedding festival was like.

In the day of Jesus, weddings were arranged by the families of the bride and groom. The groom would pay a price to the bride's family, for two reasons: one for paying for her upbringing, and two, as a gesture of the love he has for the bride. To confirm her acceptance of the marriage he would leave a chalice of wine for her. If she drank from it, the proposal was accepted. This was called the 'Blood Covenant.'

After this the groom would make an announcement, "I am going to prepare a place for you. I will return for you when it is ready." So the groom would go to his father's house and make a place for her. When the father was happy, he would allow his son to go get his bride for the wedding.

The waiting could take up to a year in some cases. So the bride and her bridesmaids had to be ever vigilant because they had no idea when the groom would return and take them to his father's house. It was a custom to keep their belongings close to their bed and their lamps ready with oil. They would know when the groom returned by the sound of a trumpet, and they would rush to meet him and continue to his father's house. Even the groom did not know the time; it was up to the father.

We are like these bridesmaids. We must be vigilant. We likewise do not know the time when Jesus will come back for us. The image of the lamps that the bridesmaids carried is a reminder to us to be the light of the world which Jesus told us to be.



For us to keep this lamp burning brightly we must keep true to what Jesus asked us to do, love God above all things and your neighbor as yourself. The light is the Holy Spirit. If we keep doing the good work He leads us to do, we can rest assured our lights will be burning brightly. If we falter and don't follow that voice we will be like the 5 foolish bridesmaids.

It is definitely not easy. As a matter of fact it is a daily struggle, but if we keep close to Jesus in prayer that flame will never go out. We must do what St. Paul always said in his letters: we must encourage each other every day and work together to keep the flame of faith burning inside each of us. Most importantly, when we pray it must be for each other. I don't think we can really do this alone. I honestly believe that our unity will be our salvation.

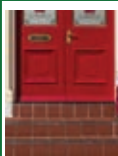

Intercessory Prayer Ministry

This is a group of people who devote specific time to pray for the needs of others in the parish. As part of the Intercessory Prayer group, each of our parish ministries will be assigned a week and create an intention for a specific need of our parish.

In order to give structure to this hour, these are the areas that we will concentrate on praying for: Church leadership, the world, our parish ministries, parish missions, parish pastoral planning, and parish spiritual events.

During the year, each ministry will be assigned a week to participate in the Intercessory Prayer devotion along with the Intercessory Prayer Ministry and the entire parish as follows:

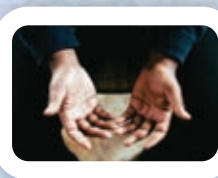
- Each member of the ministry is asked to spend an hour in prayer during the week for those intentions.
- If possible, the hour of prayer should be spent with the Blessed Sacrament which is exposed Monday through Friday for an hour after the conclusion of the 9:00am mass (from approximately 9:30 until 10:30).

If they are unable to attend in person, the members of the ministry are asked to spend an hour in prayer for the intentions sometime during that ministry's week. Choose a place and time that works for you. The exposition will be streamed on Facebook Live if this is convenient for any of the members of your ministry.

RCIA

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults is the process of welcoming people who want to be full members of the Catholic faith community. This includes those who have never been baptized, those baptized in other Christian denominations, and baptized Catholics who have not received the Sacraments of Eucharist and Confirmation. RCIA is not a “class” but rather a journey of faith. In the company of a group of faith-filled parishioners who serve as the RCIA team and with other people inquiring about the Church, and through experiences of prayer, faith-sharing, instruction, and discussion, you will have the opportunity to grow in your relationship with God as you discover how your faith could be nurtured with the Catholic tradition. 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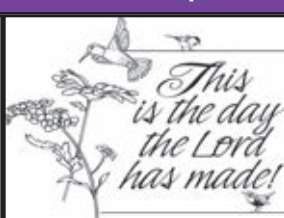
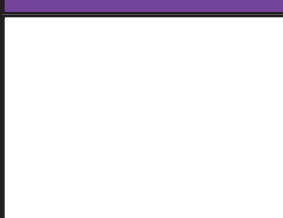
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
