Today's Gospel documents an event at the beginning of Jesus' ministry. In the time of Jesus, people with leprosy were placed well outside of society. They were told to stay away from people and to announce themselves if they came in proximity to anyone by yelling, "Unclean, unclean." If they came anywhere near people, they would be very harshly treated.

In the Gospel, Jesus searched out the lepers and seemed to do his best to be accessible to them. Why else would he be so close to a leper colony? This fits the image we have of Jesus. He is within reach of the most marginalized people. It does not really surprise me because he searched out the poor and the abandoned. The leper was alone when he came to Jesus. Did he have friends who were too afraid to go to Jesus themselves? Did his friends try to talk him out of going because it was too dangerous?

This man was not afraid! He might have talked about approaching Jesus to his friends, and they tried to talk him out of it. But he took the chance; he believed in Jesus. Listen to what he said. "if you wish you can make me clean." This was not a question. He was stating a fact. His faith was solid. A vaccine did not cure him. His faith did.

Jesus wants to do this for us also, but we need to have the same faith as that leper had. The leper obviously did not listen to any of his friends. He was not afraid of a harsh punishment because he knew Jesus would cure him.

We should not be afraid of what others might say if we need Jesus, either. With Jesus there is hope. Our hope is what saves us. Go to him always, and say the same thing to him, "If you wish you can heal me." Our faith, just like the leper's, is what will save us.

We should always believe in the promise Jesus made to us, and in this we should have no fear. It is through the hope of the promise of Christ that we will be saved. At the same time, if we have that faith, we obtain the Spirit of Christ. We no longer live for ourselves. We live with Christ within us. We are capable of doing amazing things with Jesus in us.

This brings to mind St. Francis. He began to do things that seemed crazy, but he was living as Christ needed him to live. Francis was afraid of lepers when he was young. But one day when he was older, he saw a leper and was repulsed. Then it dawned on him that this is his brother in Christ and he needs help. He jumped off the horse, embraced him, and gave him whatever money he had.

What I noticed about this was that he helped other lepers just the same and never got leprosy. I believe the reason was that the faith he had in Jesus kept him safe. Jesus will do the same for us if we wish to help our brothers and sisters.

Mind you, I have no intention of approaching someone with anything contagious and you should not either, but through Jesus all things are possible. Francis is our living proof that, through believing in the promises of Christ, we can do amazing things.

Today's Gospel is about hope! Hope and faith like this leper. Jesus will see you through, usually in ways you do not expect. Believe in Him, especially when it looks as if he totally let you down, and I guarantee, in the end, he will give you your heart's desire. Jesus never fails!!!

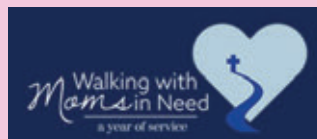
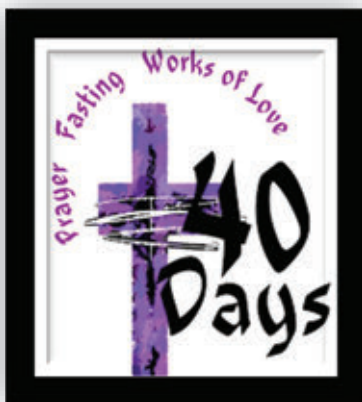

If the man is leprous and unclean, the priest shall declare him unclean by reason of the sore on his head.

"The one who bears the sore of leprosy shall keep his garments rent and his head bare, and shall muffle his beard; he shall cry out, 'Unclean, unclean!' As long as the sore is on him he shall declare himself unclean, since he is in fact unclean. He shall dwell apart, making his abode outside the camp."

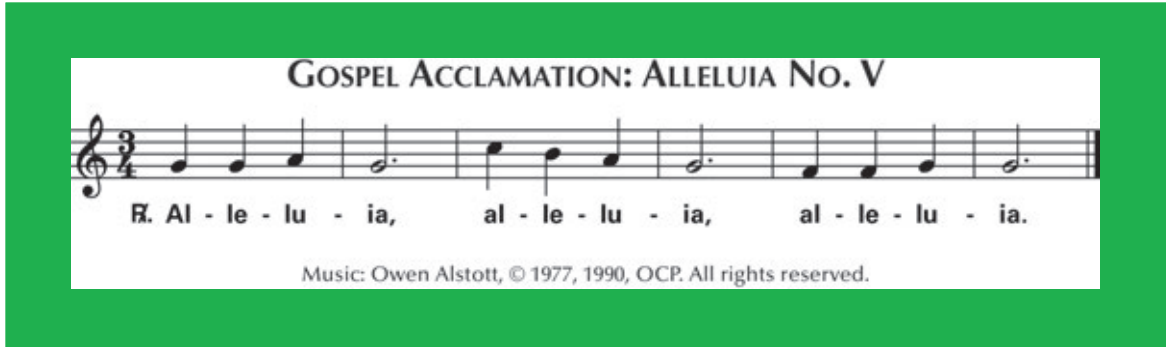

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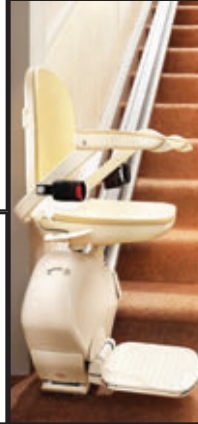
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
