Marriage: Couples contemplating marriage in the parish must contact the parish office to meet with a priest to begin the marriage preparation process. This is the first step in planning their wedding and needs to be done one year before the date of the wedding.

Baptisms: To arrange a Baptism, contact the Parish Office at least two weeks before the desired date of Baptism to make arrangements. Parents are required to attend a preparation class before the Baptism. Classes will be held at 7PM (Date will be given when you call). Please call the office to register.

25th Sunday in Ordinary Time: September 19, 2021

Summer is over here, and we are getting back into our daily routine. Children are back in school, and it is a time of separation for those who start college. I hope it was a very good summer for everyone. Despite the threat of Covid-19, we were able to protect ourselves and our families. The Gospel tells us: "the first will be the last and the last will be the first". I am praying that the Lord will continue to protect the world from this Pandemic. "Lord help us. We need you more than ever."

Since our childhood we have been taught to do our best in everything that we do. We are taught to work and to keep our grades up so we will not be the last in class. We have the intelligence to be an A+ student that always makes our parents proud of our efforts. All parents feel blessed to have the honor roll tag on their car. That makes them feel their children will be successful in life.

However, in the Gospel today we learn that the first will be last and the last will be first. We must admit that is in conflict with our basic attitude in life because human beings always manifest the desire to be successful. This is, nevertheless, sometimes true in this world. Many people are doing well even though they were not A+ students. That helps us to always have a dream.

The first possible interpretation would be to understand it as a promise, a kind of compensation in the other world: God will put first in the Kingdom of God those who would have been last here on earth. So even if I don't have a reward on earth, I will have it in the next world. This can be supported by many passages in Scripture; thus Paul writes: "it is in hope that we are saved" (Rom. 8:24). It is, therefore, not in this world, but God offers us the promise that we will enjoy a good time. The Beatitudes stated: "happy are you who weep, for you will be comforted ... Blessed are the poor, the Kingdom of Heaven is yours ..." (Luke 6: 20-21).

As Christians we need to look at this statement closely with faith and an open mind, so we do not feel confused in our prayer life. This statement by Jesus should not be served as demobilization for someone to do well in life. This statement can make someone think his or her mediocrity would even give him or her some merits. We need to continue to make our personal effort to stay closer to God and his grace. Our pain and suffering do not serve us a ticket to heaven, but our faith does. This is totally contrary to the theology of grace! If we are saved, it is without our works. Without our merits, it is the work of God alone through his love for us.

However, such theology risks leading to a certain demobilization; as in certain countries, the theology of karma makes those who are in the most extreme poverty often refuse even the humanitarian aid offered to them: they think that if they are in this difficult situation, it is because they have deserved it, and that the more they suffer today, the better their future reincarnation will be. The risk then is to do nothing more to try to improve the situation, and to withdraw from the world.

May the light of the world be upon us so that we can continue to do our best to practice our faith so that the will of God will be done in our lives. Let us continue to surrender to God's will in everything we do.

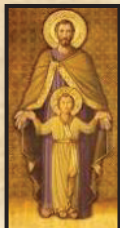

RCIA

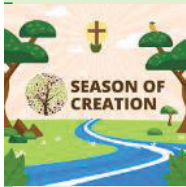

In 2015 the Paris Agreement was adapted by nearly every nation to address climate change and its negative impacts. Here's what it aims to do:

- Limit global temperature rise by reducing greenhouse gas emissions.
- Provide a framework for transparency, accountability and the achievement of more ambitious targets.
- Mobilize support for climate change mitigation and adaptation in developing nations.

Global warming greater than 1.5 Degrees Celsius could mean substantially more poverty, extreme heat, sea level rise, habitat loss, and drought.

FIRST READING: Wisdom 2:12, 17-20

The wicked say: Let us beset the just one, because he is obnoxious to us; he sets himself against our doings, reproaches us for transgressions of the law and charges us with violations. For if the just one be the son of God, God will defend him and deliver him from the hand of his foes. With revilement and torture let us put the just one to the test that we may have proof of his gentleness and try his patience. Let us condemn him to a shameful death; for according to his own words, God will take care of him.

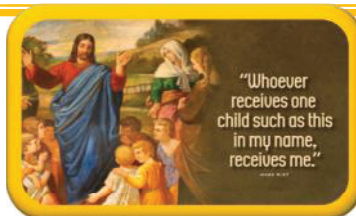

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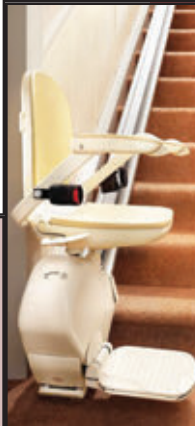
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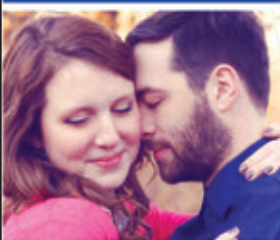
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
