26th Sunday in Ordinary Time: September 26, 2021

A MISSION TO SHARE

This weekend the church exposes us to some parts of the Bible that lead us to reflect on some hard subjects. In the first reading Moses is discouraged because of the difficult ministry that the Lord entrusted to him. Moses' spiritual life was in crisis. He could not accept the grumbling from the people. He was weak, let down, and wanted to let go. However, his faith was strong. God wanted to share his ministry with others around him by asking Moses to choose seventy people whom he trusts to become his co-workers.

This is what we call in the parish setting: the parish staff, the parish council, the finance council, the trustees, the ministry leaders. For Moses, this happens in two stages: it is Moses who must choose them; then God gives them His spirit to send them on a mission. God had said: "Gather seventy of the elders of Israel for me and you will bring them to the tent of meeting. I will take some of the spirit that is on you and put it in them." Those who are called the "elders" are men, heads of families, among the oldest. Moses makes a list of seventy elders and summons them to the Tent that housed the Ark of the Covenant. It seems in the political language that Moses will therefore be surrounded by a sort of senate.

The important aspect is the story of Eldad and Medad. Some of you may be familiar with these two names but for many these names may be new. Of the seventy men chosen by Moses, only sixty-eight answered the call and left the camp to go to the Tent of Meeting. Two of them, Eldad and Medad, remain in the camp. The text does not say whether it is out of ill will or whether this disobedience means reluctance towards Moses. God does as he had said: He "takes a part of the spirit which rested on Moses to give it to the seventy elders." Obviously, this expression surprises us but this is just a colorful way of saying that now the Elders are on a mission with Moses and, therefore, the spirit of God is with them, too. By the way, let us not forget that it was Moses who chose them himself. God respects his choice. He respects it so much that the two who remained in the camp also receive the spirit to be able to fulfill their mission.

Eldad and Medad's new behavior is not to everyone's liking. Joshua rushes to warn Moses, "Eldad and Medad are prophesying in the camp!" And there, we witness two diametrically opposed reactions. Joshua, the faithful servant of Moses, wants to defend the prerogatives of his master. He finds it quite strange for those who have disobeyed and shown independence to pretend to behave as if they had received the spirit. He calls on Moses, his master, to stop them! Joshua could not admit that those men chosen by Moses but who had not responded to his summons could also act under the power of the spirit. Moses, on the contrary, rejoices and reproaches Joshua for this reaction.

Moses remains faithful to the choice he had made. By choosing to surround himself with seventy personalities, he knew very well that he was willing to no longer be in control of everything. He rejoices since the spirit of the Lord accompanies them. His response is extraordinary! "Would you be jealous for me? If only all the people of the Lord would become a people of prophets on whom the Lord would have put his spirit!"

A few verses below, the same Book of Numbers will say, "Moses was a very humble man, more than any man on earth." (Num 12, 3). Here, we really have the proof. Moses sincerely rejoices that he is no longer alone to carry the weight of leading people by himself and that he now shares the power of the spirit he has received from God.

We remember the account of the choice of the disciples, "'He now went up onto the mountain and summoned those he wanted. So, they came to him" (Mark 3:13). He appointed twelve whom he called apostles and sent them out to preach with power to cast out demons." This group is well defined and is aware of having received the power to cast out demons because of a very strong and special bond with Jesus.

The reaction of John in the gospel is similar to Joshua's reaction in the first reading. He did not tolerate those who were not part of his group to be manifested by Holy Spirit. Likewise, Jesus forbids the Twelve from this spirit of exclusivity. When John says to him, "We have seen someone who cast out demons in your name without being part of our group. We tried to prevent him." Jesus intervenes very firmly, "Do not prevent him."

Let us learn the Christian value of tolerance. Christian tolerance asks that we bear with the weaknesses of others without condoning the evil they do, by remaining true to our conscience and beliefs, by respecting the differences we encounter, by working together on projects of common interest, by affirming what is good in the other person's position, even when we disagree, and by allowing the light of Christ to shine through our loving words and deeds.

As Mother Teresa stated: "Genuine tolerance does not mean ignoring differences as if differences made no difference. Genuine tolerance means engaging differences within a bond of civility and respect".

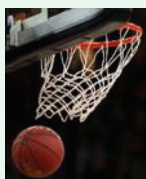

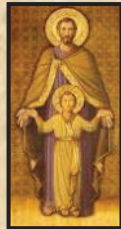
Special Collection This Weekend and Next

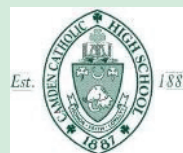

SEASON OF CREATION 2021 –Week 5 RESPONSIBILITY & ACCOUNTABILITY“

Accountability entails a serious responsibility stemming from our faith.”

Pope Francis, *Laudato Si'*

Climate change is the most critical environmental justice issue facing the world today. The recent extreme weather events and natural disasters show humanity is now paying the price of how it has been treating creation.

Tomorrow could be worse. Today's children and teenagers will face catastrophic consequences unless we take *responsibility now*. For the sake of younger generations and their future, we must choose to eat, travel, spend, invest and live differently. We need to reflect on our *accountability* before those who will have to endure the dire consequences. We must decide what kind of world we want to leave to future generations. The environment is part of a logic of receptivity. It is on loan to each generation, which must then hand it on to the next. God mandates: "Choose life, so that you and your children may live."

God's work on earth must be our own because we have been entrusted with a precious gift and it is our MORAL RESPONSIBILITY to take care of it. Christianity presents a concept of *stewardship*, showing there is an 'individual and collective responsibility' for our God-given endowment, as well as warnings against "adopting short term and seemingly inexpensive options of building on sand, instead of building on rock for our common home to withstand storms."

A core message from Pope Francis in *Laudato Si'* is that addressing the environmental challenges facing the planet begins with restoring broken relationships with God, with neighbor and with Earth itself. We are all interconnected, and if we're going to solve the problems that beset us, we have to recognize that. We cannot afford to ignore the spiritual dimension of the climate crisis in our midst. Our responsibility includes what we bring to prayer and what flows from it in terms of action.

The LORD came down in the cloud and spoke to Moses. Taking some of the spirit that was on Moses, the LORD bestowed it on the seventy elders; and as the spirit came to rest on them, they prophesied. Now two men, one named Eldad and the other Medad, were not in the gathering but had been left in the camp. They too had been on the list, but had not gone out to the tent; yet the spirit came to rest on them also, and they prophesied in the camp. So, when a young man quickly told Moses, "Eldad and Medad are prophesying in the camp," Joshua, son of Nun, who from his youth had been Moses' aide, said, "Moses, my lord, stop them." But Moses answered him, "Are you jealous for my sake? Would that all the people of the LORD were prophets! Would that the LORD might bestow his spirit on them all!"

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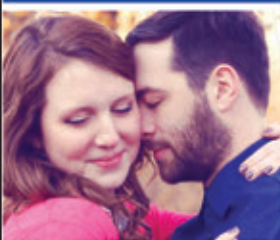
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
