Anointing of the Sick: In case of serious illness or advanced age please call the parish office. For hospital cases, contact the hospital Chaplain.

Pastoral Care: Please call the parish office to have Communion brought to an ill or homebound family member.

Marriage: Couples contemplating marriage in the parish must contact the parish office to meet with a priest to begin the marriage preparation process. This is the first step in planning their wedding and needs to be done one year before the date of the wedding.

Baptisms: To arrange a Baptism, contact the Parish Office at least two weeks before the desired date of Baptism to make arrangements. Parents are required to attend a preparation class before the Baptism. Classes will be held at 7PM (Date will be given when you call). Please call the office to register.

28th Sunday in Ordinary Time: October 10, 2021

From today's Gospel: "You are lacking in one thing. Go, sell what you have, and give to the poor and you will have treasure in heaven; then come, follow me." Think of what this guy missed out on. This would have gone from a nameless story in the Gospel of Mark to a story of "The Calling of the Whoever He Was", just like Peter or any of the other disciples. This Gospel used to bother me. Is that what we should be doing, giving it all away? Can anyone do this? After all, don't we need money to live; to pay for things like rent, mortgages, taxes, food, clothes, etc.

But caring for the poor, of course, should be our concern. How do we do it - giving to the person on the street, maybe? I wonder some times. We try not to do that because we know so many people on the street are addicted to drugs or alcohol. But so many of them have severe mental problems and are just in need. What do you do? Give them money? Is that enough? Many of these people have deep problems, and a ten dollar bill isn't going to do much.

I think of Catholic Charities. This organization is wonderful. They carefully spend the money you give them as smartly as possible. This to me seems like the best way to give to charity. But I still feel for the man on the street who obviously has severe mental problems and does not know what to do.

Whenever I hear this Gospel, I usually think of St. Francis. He did exactly that. He took his inheritance, even the clothes off his back, and gave them to the poor. He gave up everything and followed Jesus. The faith he had was remarkable, total dependence on Jesus.

Another man of faith but with a very different story is Saint Vincent de Paul. This saint was from a poor farming family and did not have anything to begin with. But he was smart and came to do great things, but he never owned much. Whatever came his way, he quickly gave away except for what he needed, and believe me, he could have easily made himself rich. St. Vincent simply worked for the Lord. Nothing he did was for his own sake, always for the care of the sick and the poor. In every experience he had, he realized that this was given to him from God. His belief was that wisdom was gained by the people and experiences in his life and this follows beautifully from the first reading from the book of Wisdom.

Wisdom comes to us through prayer and reflection on the events of our lives. This is what forms our spirituality. Money and possessions are merely an illusion. You need some to live but true peace comes from the wisdom of the Holy Spirit. The trick is that wisdom is found in helping others. St. Vincent knew this all too well.

If you are young, consider religious life. You will be doing the same thing Jesus is asking of this man. If you are a married man, think about the diaconate. I became a deacon to be closer to Jesus, and it was a decision I never regret. If you really care for the poor, volunteer in our parish or even for Catholic Charities. There are so many places where you could do wonderful things helping many different people. If you ever walk by a hospital and think there are some scared, lonely people in there, become a Eucharistic Minister and go visit the sick.

If you see a homeless person and want to help, you might talk to them, and help them find an organization that can help them. St. Vincent DePaul saw the need for organizations with specific purposes and figured out ways to make them work. Use your imagination. You might have an idea that could help a great many people, just as he did.

Reflect on this: We are all called to live lives devoted to God like Vincent DePaul. Don't get hung up on giving up everything. Get hung up on doing good for others and often as possible. There are so many opportunities to help those around you. And remember what St. Teresa of Calcutta said, "Not all of us can do great things, but all of us can do small things with great love".

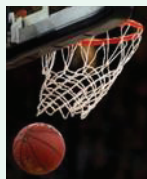

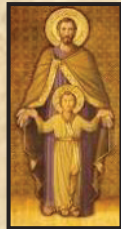


Joseph House Casseroles

For you alone are the Holy One, you alone are the Lord, you alone are the Most High, Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit, in the glory of God, the Father. Amen.

FIRST READING: Wisdom 7: 7-11 I prayed, and prudence was given me; I pleaded, and the spirit of wisdom came to me. I preferred her to scepter and throne, and deemed riches nothing in comparison with her, nor did I liken any priceless gem to her; because all gold, in view of her, is a little sand, and before her, silver is to be accounted mire. Beyond health and comeliness I loved her, and I chose to have her rather than the light, because the splendor of her never yields to sleep. Yet all good things together came to me in her company, and countless riches at her hands.

SECOND READING: Hebrews 4: 12-13 Brothers and sisters: Indeed the word of God is living and effective, sharper than any two-edged sword, penetrating even between soul and spirit, joints and marrow, and able to discern reflections and thoughts of the heart. No creature is concealed from him, but everything is naked and exposed to the eyes of him to whom we must render an account.

GOSPEL: Mark 10: 17-30

As Jesus was setting out on a journey, a man ran up, knelt down before him, and asked him, "Good teacher, what must I do to inherit eternal life?" Jesus answered him, "Why do you call me good? No one is good but God alone. You know the commandments: *You shall not kill; you shall not commit adultery; you shall not steal; you shall not bear false witness; you shall not defraud; honor your father and your mother.*" He replied and said to him, "Teacher, all of these I have observed from my youth." Jesus, looking at him, loved him and said to him, "You are lacking in one thing. Go, sell what you have, and give to the poor and you will have treasure in heaven; then come, follow me." At that statement his face fell, and he went away sad, for he had many possessions.

Jesus looked around and said to his disciples, "How hard it is for those who have wealth to enter the kingdom of God!" The disciples were amazed at his words. So Jesus again said to them in reply, "Children, how hard it is to enter the kingdom of God! It is easier for a camel to pass through the eye of a needle than for one who is rich to enter the kingdom of God." They were exceedingly astonished and said among themselves, "Then who can be saved?" Jesus looked at them and said, "For human beings it is impossible, but not for God. All things are possible for God." Peter began to say to him, "We have given up everything and followed you." Jesus said, "Amen, I say to you, there is no one who has given up house or brothers or sisters or mother or father or children or lands for my sake and for the sake of the gospel who will not receive a hundred times more now in this present age: houses and brothers and sisters and mothers and children and lands, with persecutions, and eternal life in the age to come."

I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father, through him all things were made. 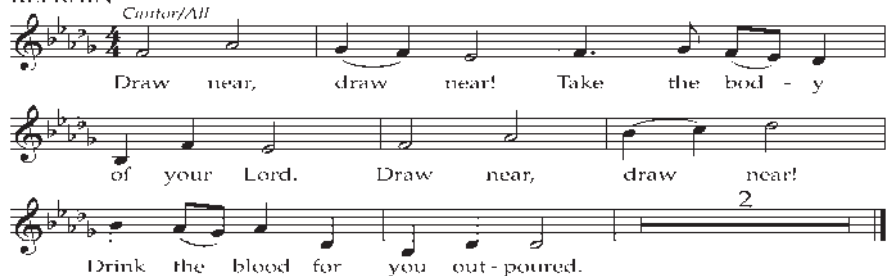
At the words that follow, up to and including “and became man”, all bow.

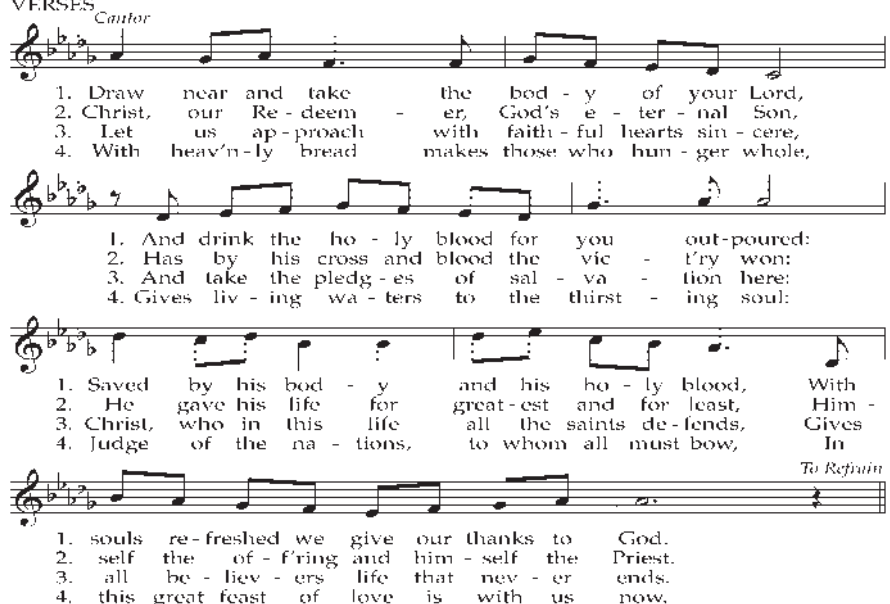

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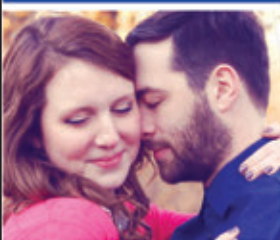
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
