29th Sunday in Ordinary Time: October 17, 2021

This past Sunday Pope Francis officially celebrated a mass to pray for the World Synod that will happen in 2023. What is a Synod? It is a meeting of bishops from all over the world established by Pope Paul VI, 15 September 1965, in response to the desire of the Fathers of the Second Vatican Council to discuss doctrinal or pastoral matters (Diocese of Camden website). This Sunday, October 17 at 3 pm our diocese will have a mass inviting 4 members from each parish and all the pastors of the parishes in the diocese to pray for the success of the Synod's first phase process.

In the letter that came out to the pastors, the role of the four delegates is described as such: "The four lay representatives from each parish will have the responsibility of gathering groups of parishioners (from October 18th to November 21st) to discuss the synod documents and complete an online response to the official questionnaire for the parish by November 30th. They will also represent the parish at deanery level meetings in February of 2022. After receiving the input of the deaneries, the diocese will forward its response to the USCCB in March". You are all invited to participate with the delegates so you can join with the whole Church to support the Synod for a Church of Communion, Participation, and Mission.

During this month of October, we will celebrate World Mission Week. We, as baptized and confirmed Christians, are all sent in mission for the Lord. Like Moses, we are all invited to pray in support of all those who share the gospel in the world. Many Christians are facing persecution and violence of all kinds. They count on us to support them with our personal and community prayer. To believe in intercessory prayer is to not give up. This will only be possible if we join in prayer.

This Sunday Jesus invites us to be humble. The disciples asked Jesus, "Who is the greatest?" Who is the first among them? Today's Gospel and the Old Testament reading provide us with an answer: the greatest is the one who becomes a servant and even a slave. He is the one who shares his talents, treasure, and time to become a servant of the Lord and share the burden of others, even accepting to share in their sufferings.

The answer from Jesus invites the disciples and all of us to revise our way of living within our society. We think of all those who are committed to serve the Lord through service. For some, this requires political or spiritual engagement; others find their place in a humanitarian association; still others are engaged in the service of their parish. On this Sunday, we are especially invited to join in the fight against poverty. This requires greater attention to those who are its victims. Through our commitments, our gestures of sharing and solidarity, we participate in the mission of Christ who made himself a servant.

God is a liberating God; this is the first aspect of the Creed of Israel. On the other hand, we understand how all the prophets fought with all their might against human suffering. They called it an abomination. So, when the disciples heard Jesus say to them, "I must give my life as a ransom for the multitude," it did not occur to them for a minute that God could demand the execution of his Son. The people of Israel had known for a long time that God has no wrath against humanity and that he does not want human sacrifice.

Clearly, here, Jesus presents himself not as a triumphant king but as the suffering servant from the prophet Isaiah: "The Son of man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give his life. Through him the will of the Lord shall be fulfilled," that is, the salvation of mankind. Non-violence, forgiveness, service, and humility are the only ways to change the heart of humanity. We, his disciples, who are the nucleus and the leaven of this world, must be the image of the Son of God, making ourselves servants. As Parishioners of Saint Teresa of Calcutta, we are to follow Christ in this modern world that is dominated by the pursuit of power and prestige.

Indeed, the whole Bible tells us that God places himself at the service of humanity. He makes himself small, humble, and a servant to help us better accept the salvation he offers us. The letter to the Hebrews (2nd reading) tells us that Christ shared our trials. Pope John Paul II said he gave God to us and us to God.

Joseph House Donations

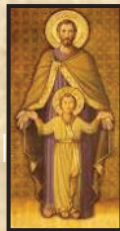
Our parishioners donated the following to the home less in September:

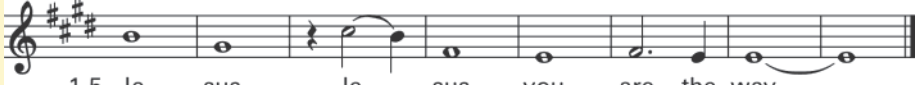

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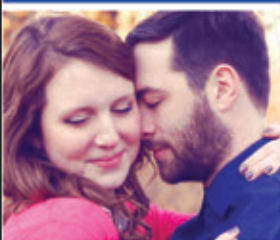
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
