30th Sunday in Ordinary Time: October 24, 2021

The message in this Sunday's gospel is stronger than any argument to the contrary. In the heart of man there is a voice that cries out. We all have this voice within us. It is a voice that comes out spontaneously, without anyone commanding it, a voice that questions the meaning of our journey here below, especially when we find ourselves in the dark: "Jesus, have mercy on me! Jesus, have mercy on me! " It is a beautiful prayer. (Pope Francis: General Audience of May 6, 2020)

Everything is possible for those who believe. (Mk. 9:23). This miraculous healing of a blind man, at this precise moment, certainly resonates as a revelation of the true identity of Jesus. Bartimaeus is a blind man who is the first to open his eyes and calls Jesus "Son of David" (one of the titles of the Messiah). In the Gospel of Saint Mark, this healing is immediately followed by the triumphal entry into Jerusalem, where Jesus is greeted as the Messiah: "Blessed is he who comes in the Name of the Lord. Blessed be the kingdom that is to come, the kingdom of David our father" (Mk.11:9).

We are tempted to make the connection with the announcement of Jeremiah that we heard in the first reading: "The LORD saves his people, the rest of Israel ... There are even among them the blind and the lame" (Jer. 31). We make this connection especially since, in Jesus' day, this prophecy of Jeremiah was seen as an announcement of the Messiah.

Curiously, Jesus does not seek to keep this last miracle secret. In Chapter 8, Mark had already talked about an identical miracle. It was at Bethsaida, in Galilee, just before Peter's profession of faith at Caesarea. But then Jesus had not allowed either the healed blind man or the disciples to give him the slightest publicity. Mark said, "He sternly told them not to tell anyone about him." He did this because, at this stage of his life, one still risked misunderstanding his title of Messiah. One dreamed only too much of a glorious messiah, forcibly driving out the Roman empire.

This time, on the contrary, at the gates of Jerusalem, Jesus agrees for the first time to be recognized for what he is: the Messiah, the son of David. This is the first time this title appears in the Gospel of Mark. For now, things are clear. Jesus is recognized as the Messiah by calling himself "Son of Man", but he immediately clarified that it would be in the manner of a servant and not a master. This healing confirms that Jesus is indeed the expected Messiah. He fulfilled in his person what the prophet Isaiah said of the Servant of God: "I, the LORD, have called you for the victory of justice; I have grasped you by the hand; I formed you, and set you as a covenant of the people, a light for the nations, to open the eyes of the blind, to bring out prisoners from confinement, and from the dungeon, those who live in darkness" (Is. 42: 6 - 7).

At another passage in Isaiah, for example: "Then the eyes of the blind will see, and the ears of the deaf will be opened. Then the lame will leap like a stag, and the mouth of the mute will cry out for joy" (Is. 35: 5-6). More and more the meek will rejoice in the LORD and the poor people will rejoice because of the Holy One of Israel." (Is. 29:18-19).

May the Lord continue to give us all strength to cry out "Jesus Son of David have mercy on us and the whole world". I am presently attending the Convocation with all the priests in the diocese, and I will continue to keep you all in my prayers.

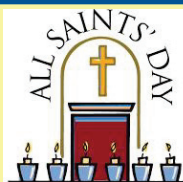

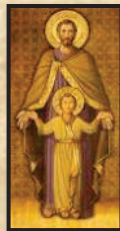

FIRST READING: Jeremiah 31: 7-9

Thus says the LORD: Shout with joy for Jacob, exult at the head of the nations; proclaim your praise and say: The LORD has delivered his people, the remnant of Israel. Behold, I will bring them back from the land of the north; I will gather them from the ends of the world, with the blind and the lame in their midst, the mothers and those with child; they shall return as an immense throng. They departed in tears, but I will console them and guide them; I will lead them to brooks of water, on a level road, so that none shall stumble. For I am a father to Israel, Ephraim is my first-born.

RESPONSORIAL PSALM: *The Lord has done great things for us; we are filled with joy.*

SECOND READING: Hebrews 5: 1-6

Brothers and sisters: Every high priest is taken from among men and made their representative before God, to offer gifts and sacrifices for sins. He is able to deal patiently with the ignorant and erring, for he himself is beset by weakness and so, for this reason, must make sin offerings for himself as well as for the people. No one takes this honor upon himself but only when called by God, just as Aaron was. In the same way, it was not Christ who glorified himself in becoming high priest, but rather the one who said to him: *You are my son: this day I have begotten you*; just as he says in another place: *You are a priest forever according to the order of Melchizedek*.

GOSPEL: Mark 10: 46-52

As Jesus was leaving Jericho with his disciples and a sizable crowd, Bartimaeus, a blind man, the son of Timaeus, sat by the roadside begging. On hearing that it was Jesus of Nazareth, he began to cry out and say, "Jesus, son of David, have pity on me." And many rebuked him, telling him to be silent. But he kept calling out all the more, "Son of David, have pity on me." Jesus stopped and said, "Call him." So they called the blind man, saying to him, "Take courage; get up, Jesus is calling you." He threw aside his cloak, sprang up, and came to Jesus. Jesus said to him in reply, "What do you want me to do for you?" The blind man replied to him, "Master, I want to see." Jesus told him, "Go your way; your faith has saved you." Immediately he received his sight and followed him on the way.

He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.

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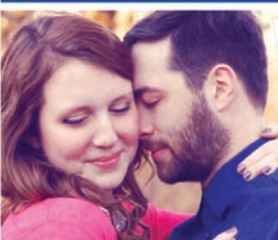
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
