Anointing of the Sick: In case of serious illness or advanced age please call the parish office. For hospital cases, contact the hospital Chaplain.

Pastoral Care: Please call the parish office to have Communion brought to an ill or homebound family member.

Marriage: Couples contemplating marriage in the parish must contact the parish office to meet with a priest to begin the marriage preparation process. This is the first step in planning their wedding and needs to be done one year before the date of the wedding.

Baptisms: To arrange a Baptism, contact the Parish Office at least two weeks before the desired date of Baptism to make arrangements. Parents are required to attend a preparation class before the Baptism. Classes will be held at 7PM (Date will be given when you call). Please call the office to register.

Thoughts on Faith

I have always read Jesus' response to his apostles' request to "increase our faith" as criticism. "If you have faith the size of a mustard seed..." I thought Jesus sounded exasperated, as if he was saying "I wish you had such faith—look what you could do with even this little amount." But since asking for more faith seems like a perfectly reasonable request, I'm wondering whether Jesus is saying something else to us.

Faith is a hard thing to talk about—we can't measure it or quantify it or even sometimes identify it. We might look to the lives of the saints, and we say yes, that is faith. Look how they lived their lives. We might know some people in our own families who are extraordinarily centered and firm and we say yes, they have faith. Some of us would say our faith is shaky. Some of us would say our faith has disappeared. Most of us would say we want more faith, just as the apostles said to Jesus.

How do we know if we have faith? There is no more comforting experience than to feel one's faith vibrant and operative. We go to mass, and we know God's peace in our hearts. We face a difficult situation and know God's presence in the moment. We hear a call to volunteer and find joy in the service. All these experiences signal to us that God is alive and with us. Our faith seems strong.

But what of those times when God seems so very far away? We struggle, we doubt, we pray, we don't hear answers. We find no joy in mass, we see darkness, not light. Does that mean our faith is gone?

Maybe we can understand faith by thinking about love. Love can be overwhelmingly sweet and warm and when we know those sensations, we are sure of our love. But love can also be unemotional. Love can be a decision we make every day, even when we don't feel those cozy sensations. Love is more than a feeling.

It is the same with faith. We can never equate feeling faith with having faith. Sometimes we need to ride out those dim and dry moments of our faith, for just because we don't feel God doesn't mean that God isn't present and acting in our lives. Nor does it mean that we are not living faithfully. Our patron, St. Teresa, went through years of wondering where her faith went, but she never despaired of God, and she never stopped living for God and others. She clung to her longing for faith, and that was her faith.

In today's first reading we hear "For the vision still has its time, presses on to fulfillment, and will not disappoint; if it delays, wait for it, it will surely come, it will not be late." Patience and fortitude are faith's companions. We can always ask God for more faith but let us not dismiss what we already have been given. Maybe accepting our own meager mustard seed amount, whether we feel it or not, AND USING IT, will be more than enough to move a forest or two.

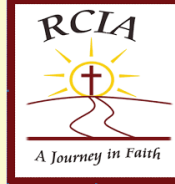


St. Teresa of Calcutta Bereavement Ministry

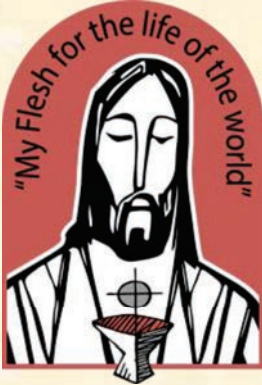

This weekend, October 1- 2, and for the next 5 weeks, there will be an insert in each week's bulletin about the part of the Mass that will be explained by the priest at Mass on the following week. For example, the October 1-2 insert will focus on the Introductory Rites of the Mass, and that will be the part explained by the priest on October 8-9. You are encouraged to read and prayerfully reflect on this material during the week so that you will better understand the brief explanation given by the priest.

Following the series of teaching Masses we will celebrate the Solemnity of Christ the King and the end of the Liturgical Year.

The Lord replied, "If you have faith the size of a mustard seed, you would say to this mulberry tree, 'Be uprooted and planted in the sea,' and it would obey you. 'Who among you would say to your servant who has just come in from plowing or tending sheep in the field, 'Come here immediately and take your place at table'? Would he not rather say to him, 'Prepare something for me to eat. Put on your apron and wait on me while I eat and drink. You may eat and drink when I am finished'? Is he grateful to that servant because he did what was commanded? So should it be with you. When you have done all you have been commanded, say, 'We are unprofitable servants; we have done what we were obliged to do.'"

I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.

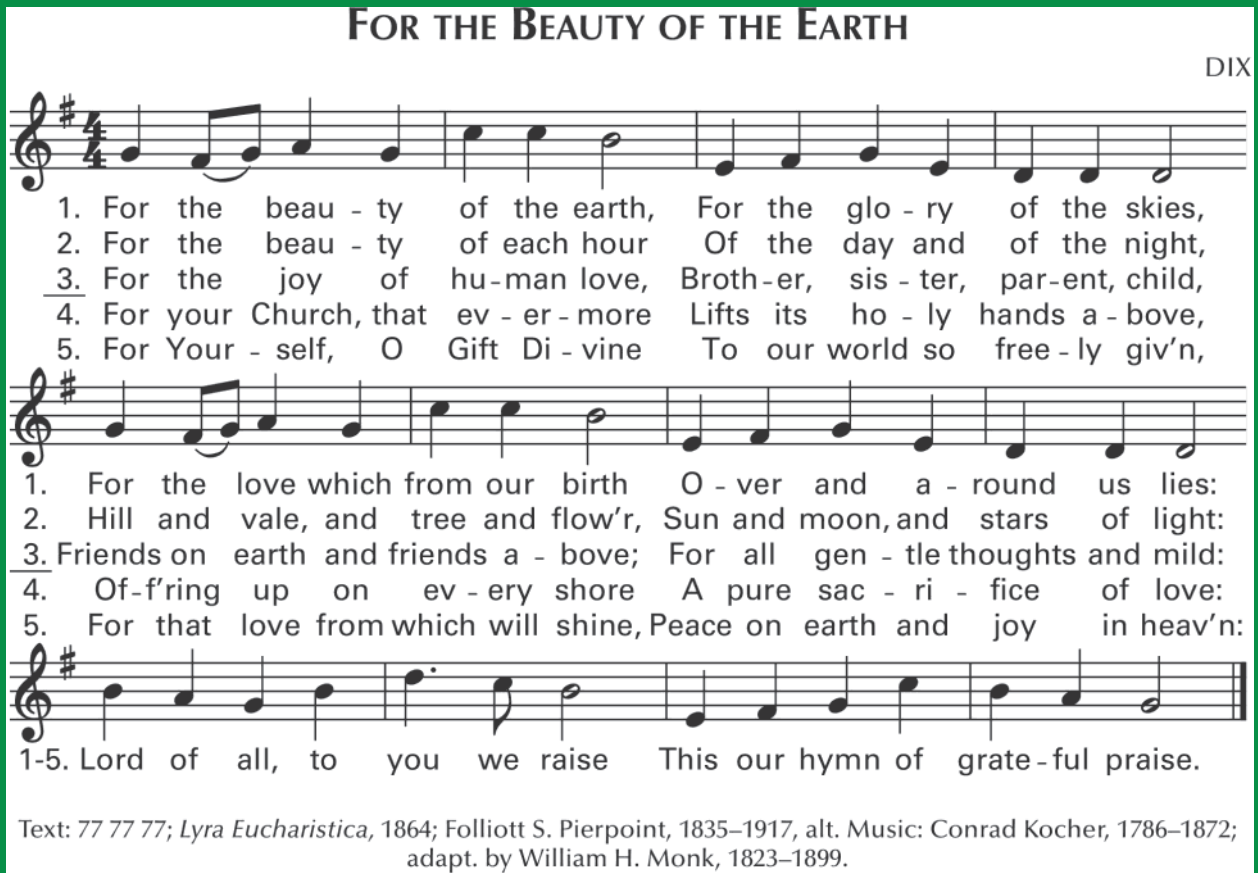

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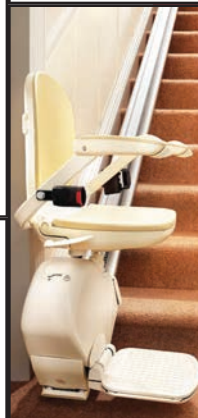
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
