Parents are required to attend a preparation class before the Baptism. Classes will be held at 7PM (Date will be given when you call). Please call the office to register.

Twenty-eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time: October 9, 2022

In today's reflection let us look at the relationship between Elisha in the first reading and Jesus in the Gospel. Elisha was the successor of the prophet Elijah. You might not be familiar with Elisha but he was the most powerful of the Old Testament prophets. More powerful than Elijah, when he became Elijah's successor, before the Lord brought Elijah into Heaven on a fiery chariot Elisha asked the Lord to increase His Spirit to be twice as powerful as Elijah - strange sounding I am sure. Elisha was known as the greatest miracle worker. It was said he was so holy that when he died and was put into the grave, his body touched another corpse and that corpse came back to life. You cannot make this stuff up - very strange story.

The first reading is the conclusion of a very interesting story of the healing of Naaman. Naaman was a commander in the Syrian army, not Jewish, a Gentile and he also suffered from leprosy. Naaman found out from a captured Israeli girl that the God of Israel could perform great miracles. So he sent word to the Israeli King, and the King's response was that only God could heal leprosy. It was believed that it was impossible to cure someone of leprosy.

When Elisha hears about the man, he informs Naaman to go to the Jordan River and wash in it seven times and he will be healed. Can you believe Naaman had a problem with this because he knew nicer rivers in his own country? But he did it anyway and was healed, and he converted to professing his faith in the Lord of Israel.

Now look at the relationship: Elisha was the successor of Elijah. Jesus referred to John the Baptist as the new Elijah. Remember that it was said that before the Messiah returns Elijah would come back, Jesus referred to John the Baptist as the new Elijah. Jesus was the successor of John the Baptist; Jesus was like the new Elisha.

In the first reading we have the conversion of one Gentile with Elisha. Jesus, is God, obviously much more powerful than Elisha, and He cured ten lepers. Like Jesus, Elisha was ten times more powerful! For the miracle Elisha performed, Naaman had to go to the Jordan and wash seven times. With Jesus, they just had to trust, turn and go show themselves to the priests of the Temple.

Think about what is said in the Old Testament story. In the story, the Israeli King declares leprosy can only be cured by God himself. In this story we get a clue that Jesus is really divine in nature. Note also the man Jesus healed was also a Samaritan, a conversion to the God of Israel just like Elijah.

What do we walk away with from these readings? In the Gospel ten people have an encounter with God but only one really leaves with all that God intended for them. Ten people united together not by race or nationality but by their disease. Many people probably passed them every day and walked around them to avoid them as best they could.

But read what it says: Jesus saw them, He saw them in their pain, and it seems Jesus was very good at seeing people in their pain. He sees them and He heals them. Why is this? Because Jesus is the hope of the world! We have all been lepers; some of us still are, separated by God and the community by sin. But Jesus sees us. He sees us in our pain, and sin always seems to lead to some kind of pain. Someone always seems to get hurt. But Jesus sees us, all of us, in this pain and so many times we are like the nine lepers who never came back to give thanks.

Today at this Mass think about all the times we let Jesus down by not returning to give thanks. Think of the unbelievable things Jesus did for you, and I know he did amazing things for you because he does them for me all the time. But we just move on in our business. Jesus sees us and heals us and we don't even notice.

I received a letter this week from a very good friend and the timing was remarkable. It was about thankfulness. When God gives you a gift, He always gives two things: the first is the gift, of course, but the second is the ability to see the amazing generosity of the Lord. He literally gives us evidence that He exists and moves among us, searching out those in pain. That thankfulness is the greatest feeling in the world and we just move on.

Think about it. When you are grateful, you cannot sin. It is impossible. Thankfulness fills our hearts to the greatness of God. Anger, lust, and revenge have no business in our hearts. The amazement of what Jesus did is all that remains. At least for a time, sin always seems to have a way of creeping back in, but it does not have to be if we live in the thankfulness of the Lord.

Where do we go from here?

On the evening of Tuesday, September 20th, many gathered at Holy Saviour Church to listen to the wisdom of Joseph Stoutzenberger and Frank Champine share from their book, ***SINGING WITH CRICKETS: MEDITATIONS ON FRANCIS OF ASSISI AND NATURE***. It was an inspiring and thought provoking evening.

Simultaneously, a UN General Assembly meeting entitled: "Our World Is in Peril", was in attendance where world leaders opened with dire assessments of a planet beset by escalating crises and conflicts. Secretary General Antonio Guterres opened with the words, "We are gridlocked in colossal global dysfunction—our world is in peril -and paralyzed." In a forum for curing humanity's ills, a forum dedicated to the idea of bringing the world together, many leaders sounded a common theme: the globe needs cooperation, dialogue, and trust, now more than ever. The common denominator: Let's work as one, as a coalition of the world, a united nations.(Peltz,AP-Inquirer)

For us, as Christians, a new story is emerging. We are living in a time of liminal in-between. We know that the layers of crises we face will not be solved with technological, political, or economic strategies alone. There is a deeper transformation of heart that is necessary to welcome a new story. What is ultimately required is a change of heart, a shift in how we relate to each other and to the whole of the living Earth...it is a shift from mind to heart, it is spiritual at the core. We must therefore encourage and support the "ecological conversion" which in recent decades has made humanity more sensitive to the catastrophe to which it has been heading.

Let us pray as one, as Elizabeth Johnson, CSJ, writes: "A flourishing humanity on a thriving planet rich in species in an evolving universe, all together filled with the glory of God."

St Francis of Assisi said at his death: "I have done what is mine to do, may Christ teach you what is yours."

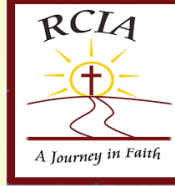

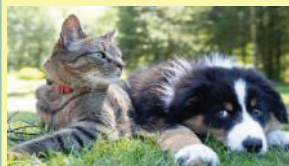

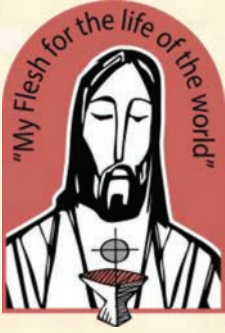

Lord Jesus Christ, Only Begotten Son, Lord God, Lamb of God, Son of the Father, you take away the sins of the world, have mercy on us; you take away the sins of the world, receive our prayer; you are seated at the right hand of the Father, have mercy on us. For you alone are the Holy One, you alone are the Lord, you alone are the Most High, Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit, in the glory of God, the Father. Amen.

FIRST READING: 2 Kings 5: 14-17

Naaman went down and plunged into the Jordan seven times at the word of Elisha, the man of God. His flesh became again like the flesh of a little child, and he was clean of his leprosy. Naaman returned with his whole retinue to the man of God. On his arrival he stood before Elisha and said, "Now I know that there is no God in all the earth, except in Israel. Please accept a gift from _____ your _____ servant."

Elisha replied, "As the LORD lives whom I serve, I will not take it;" and despite Naaman's urging, he still refused. Naaman said: "If you will not accept, please let me, your servant, have two mule-loads of earth, for I will no longer offer holocaust or sacrifice to any other god except to the LORD."

SECOND READING: 2 Timothy 2: 8-13

Beloved: Remember Jesus Christ, raised from the dead, a descendant of David: such is my gospel, for which I am suffering, even to the point of chains, like a criminal. But the word of God is not chained. Therefore, I bear with everything for the sake of those who are chosen, so that they too may obtain the salvation that is in Christ Jesus, together with eternal glory. This saying is trustworthy: If we have died with him we shall also live with him; if we persevere we shall also reign with him. But if we deny him he will deny us. If we are unfaithful he remains faithful, for he cannot deny himself.

GOSPEL: Luke 17: 11-19

As Jesus continued his journey to Jerusalem, he traveled through Samaria and Galilee. As he was entering a village, ten lepers met him. They stood at a distance from him and raised their voices, saying, "Jesus, Master! Have pity on us!" And when he saw them, he said, "Go show yourselves to the priests." As they were going they were cleansed. And one of them, realizing he had been healed, returned, glorifying God in a loud voice; and he fell at the feet of Jesus and thanked him. He was a Samaritan. Jesus said in reply, "Ten were cleansed, were they not? Where are the other nine? Has none but this foreigner returned to give thanks to God?" Then he said to him, "Stand up and go; your faith has saved you."

At the words that follow, up to and including “and became man”, all bow.

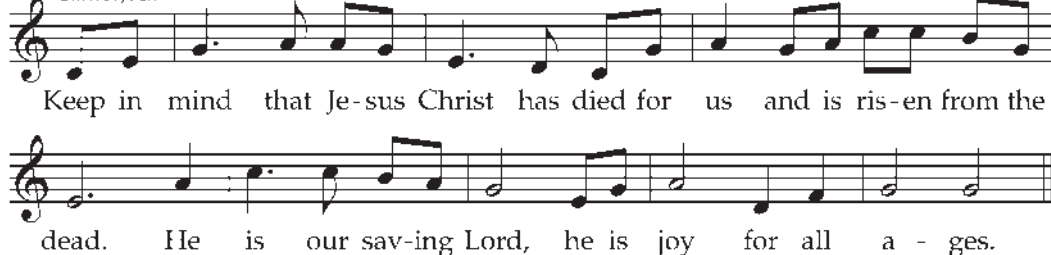
And by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man.

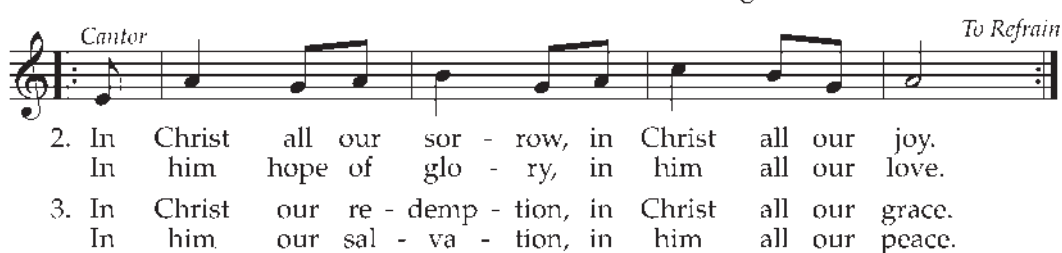

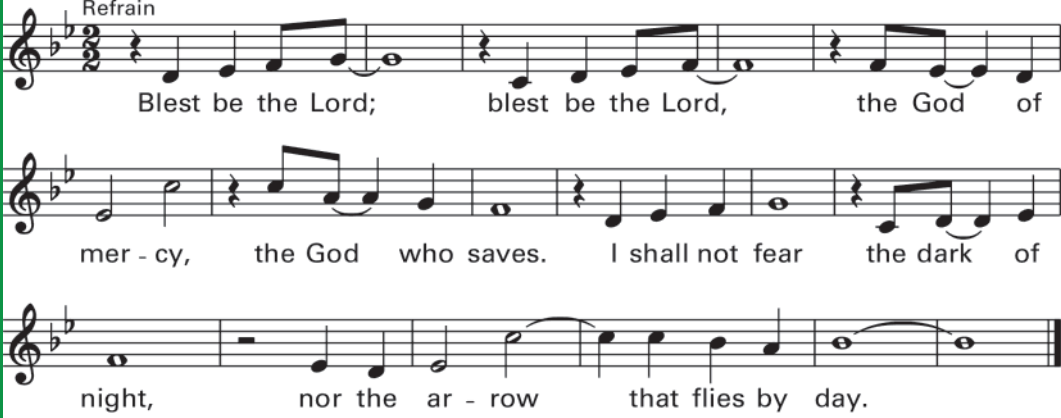

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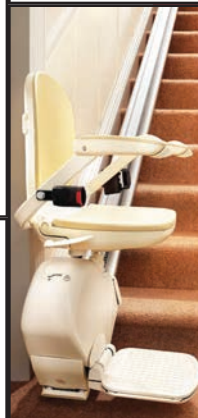
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
