Registration: We invite all parishioners to register with the Parish. Registration helps us to serve you when issuing letters in connection with sponsorship of Baptism, Confirmation or Matrimony, and for letters of reference. Kindly notify the office if your address changes.

Anointing of the Sick: In case of serious illness or advanced age please call the parish office. For hospital cases, contact the hospital Chaplain.

Pastoral Care: Please call the parish office to have Communion brought to an ill or homebound family member.

Marriage: Couples contemplating marriage in the parish must contact the parish office to meet with a priest to begin the marriage preparation process. This is the first step in planning their wedding and needs to be done one year before the date of the wedding.

Baptisms: To arrange a Baptism, contact the Parish Office at least two weeks before the desired date of Baptism to make arrangements. Parents are required to attend a preparation class before the Baptism. Classes will be held at 7PM (Date will be given when you call). Please call the office to register.

Zacchaeus saw the people of Jericho gathering on the side of the road to watch Jesus passing by. He was tiny and could not see Jesus with his eyes, so he climbed up a sycamore tree. Suddenly, something extraordinary happens; Jesus looks at him and says: "Zacchaeus, today I must come to you!" Each of us has a handicap that hinders us from seeing Jesus around us or close to us. We need Jesus to look at us, challenge us and invite himself into our lives. What an honor that Jesus invites himself to Zacchaeus' house. Zacchaeus rushes to open his home and organizes a meal, and Jesus went to share his table. Jesus met a lot of criticism for going to Zacchaeus' house. Like Zacchaeus, Jesus came to touch our wounds, to lean on our weaknesses, and to put us back on our feet; this is our great hope. No one directs him to us. He sees our desire to be with him and to meet him at some point in our lives. Hope transforms our powerlessness into inventive actions. It doesn't take much for Jesus to invite Himself into our home. Just open our hearts and our lives to accept him.

The inhabitants of Jericho view Zacchaeus as a sinner. The gaze of Jesus upon him is different from the society's view of him; Jesus sees the beauty of our being, created in the image and likeness of God. He uniquely looks at us with the eyes of a savior, a brother, a friend, and a way-maker. Salvation came to the house of Zacchaeus because "he sought to see who Jesus was." Amid his worries, his desires were satisfied. This encounter with Jesus introduced him to a new life. Our situation is too often dragging us out of being where we should be to receive his tender care. Under the loving gaze of Jesus, Zacchaeus' life and situation were turned around! In the secret of his heart and the secret of the heart of Jesus there is an amazing covenant. Following Jesus, we want to live this mystery of welcoming the "poor", of being in solidarity with the poor in Christ. This is how we find the joy and freshness of our life. Jesus invites himself into our house and shares his Body and Blood with us. We offer him our heart and love so he can come to change and transform life with his joy.

Jesus says to us today the same words he told Zacchaeus, "Today Salvation has come to your house because you, too, are a son of Abraham." Let us continue to invite Him into our homes and lives so that we can share our possessions, wealth, and situation with him. He wants to renew our lives, to warm what is cold, to straighten what is twisted, and strengthen what is worn out. Jesus gives us the opportunity to read about his words, to hear and respond to his call so that we become the gospel message by witnessing to his love that he came to share with the world. Jesus came to seek and save what was lost. Our past is in his hands and in his heart. Our present and our future are his preoccupations. The important action that we are called to do is to welcome his joy daily in our lives. With Zacchaeus, we want to come down from the tree of our pride, the tree of our business, the tree of our indifference, the tree of our hatred, and the tree of being self-centered and auto-sufficient to welcome Jesus with great joy, Him, the bread of life. So, we can say, "Lord, I am not worthy that you come under my roof, but only say a word and my soul shall be healed."

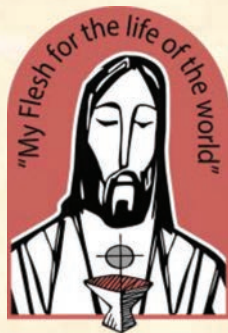

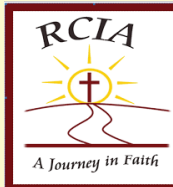

GLORIA: Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace to people of good will. We praise you; we bless you; we adore you; we glorify you; we give you thanks for your great glory, Lord God, heavenly King, O God, almighty Father. Lord Jesus Christ, Only Begotten Son, Lord God, Lamb of God, Son of the Father, you take away the sins of the world, have mercy on us; you take away the sins of the world, receive our prayer; you are seated at the right hand of the Father, have mercy on us. For you alone are the Holy One, you alone are the Lord, you alone are the Most High, Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit, in the glory of God, the Father. Amen.

FIRST READING: Wisdom 11:22—12:2

Before the LORD the whole universe is as a grain from a balance or a drop of morning dew come down upon the earth. But you have mercy on all, because you can do all things; and you overlook people's sins that they may repent. For you love all things that are and loathe nothing that you have made; for what you hated, you would not have fashioned. And how could a thing remain, unless you willed it; or be preserved, had it not been called forth by you? But you spare all things, because they are yours, O LORD and lover of souls, for your imperishable spirit is in all things! Therefore you rebuke offenders little by little, warn them and remind them of the sins they are committing, that they may abandon their wickedness and believe in you, O LORD!

RESPONSORIAL PSALM: *I will praise your name forever, my king and my God.*

SECOND READING: 2 Thessalonians 1:11—2:2

Brothers and sisters: We always pray for you, that our God may make you worthy of his calling and powerfully bring to fulfillment every good purpose and every effort of faith, that the name of our Lord Jesus may be glorified in you, and you in him, in accord with the grace of our God and Lord Jesus Christ.

We ask you, brothers and sisters, with regard to the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ and our assembling with him, not to be shaken out of your minds suddenly, or to be alarmed either by a "spirit," or by an oral statement, or by a letter allegedly from us to the effect that the day of the Lord is at hand.

GOSPEL: Luke 19: 1-10

At that time, Jesus came to Jericho and intended to pass through the town. Now a man there named Zacchaeus, who was a chief tax collector and also a wealthy man, was seeking to see who Jesus was; but he could not see him because of the crowd, for he was short in stature. So he ran ahead and climbed a sycamore tree in order to see Jesus, who was about to pass that way. When he reached the place, Jesus looked up and said, "Zacchaeus, come down quickly, for today I must stay at your house." And he came down quickly and received him with joy. When they all saw this, they began to grumble, saying, "He has gone to stay at the house of a sinner." But Zacchaeus stood there and said to the Lord, "Behold, half of my possessions, Lord, I shall give to the poor, and if I have extorted anything from anyone I shall repay it four times over." And Jesus said to him, "Today salvation has come to this house because this man too is a descendant of Abraham. For the Son of Man has come to seek and to save what was lost."

CREED: I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father, through him all things were made. For us men and for our salvation, he came down from heaven.

At the words that follow, up to and including “and became man”, all bow.

And by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man.

For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate, he suffered death and was buried, and rose again on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. 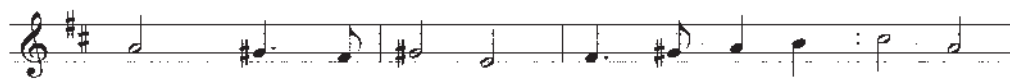
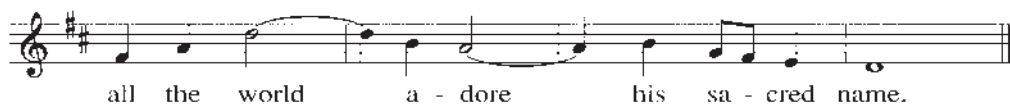

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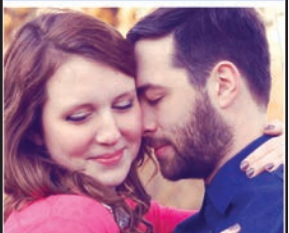


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
