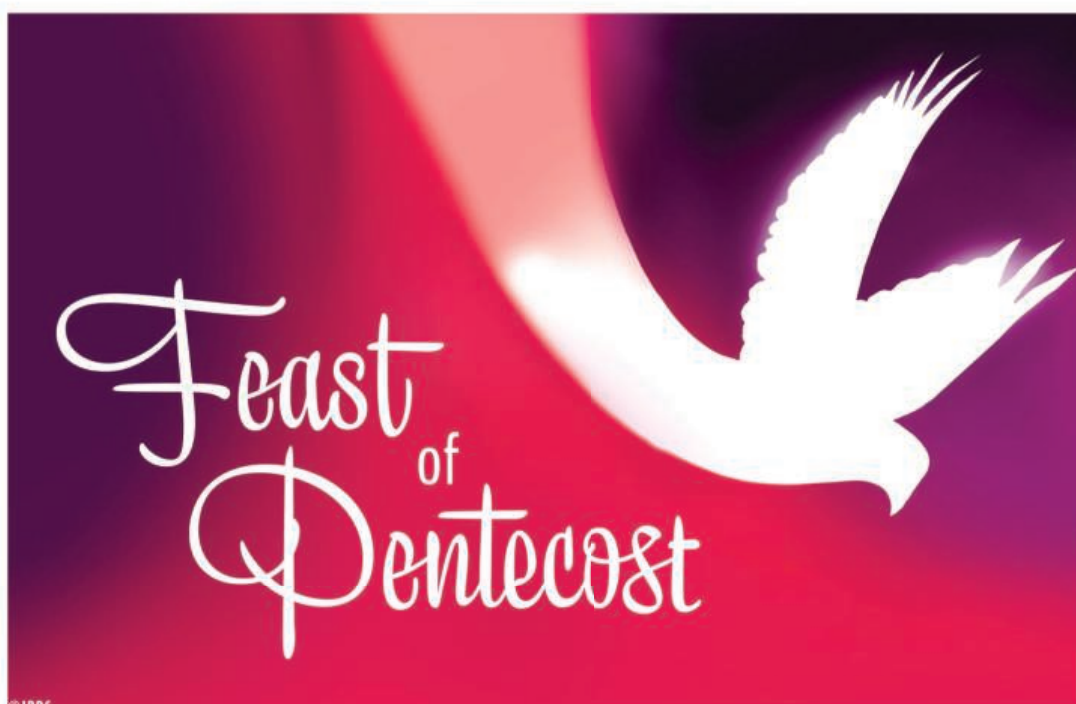

Pentecost Sunday: May 28, 2023

On this day when the Most Holy Church of our mother celebrates Pentecost, that is, the descent of the Holy Spirit on the Apostles in the Cenacle on the fiftieth day after Easter, we want to focus on the following theme: Let us be guided by the Spirit who ignites us to our missionary work: announcing peace, joy, forgiveness, and salvation.

The Holy Spirit descends on the Apostles to cast out their fear and to invite them to take on their mission. The Spirit God gives us does not make us fearful, but gives us power, love, and self-discipline (2Tm 1:7). Even though they faced many dangers while Jesus was still physically with them, that was nothing compared to what they were going to face in living out their mission. They were challenged by those who did not want to listen to Jesus' preaching and were encouraged by the converts and those who opened their hearts to listen to the Word that changed their lives.

From their previous situation of fear and intimidation, once they received the promised gift, the Paraclete, they are now "sent" into the world to preach, to teach and to bless.

My brothers and sisters, celebrating Pentecost is not celebrating a past event; it is a feast that helps us to realize that the Spirit of God is always at work in the world and in every believer. Each of us, according to his or her status in the Church, is called to be guided by the Holy Spirit who is "the soul of the mission" as Pope Francis emphasized it. Without the Holy Spirit, no real mission is possible. Without the Holy Spirit, we are fearful beings.

The Holy Spirit remains unknown to many. We pray to God the Father, we pray to God the Son, and we honor the Blessed Virgin Mary, but few take the time to invoke the Holy Spirit who accompanies us daily in our ministry. This is not a task reserved for ordained ministers or apostles; this is a mission to which all Christians are invited. This is why in the second reading Paul insists on the action of the Holy Spirit in each believer. It establishes the relationship between unity and diversity. The Holy Spirit is the source of unity despite our diversity of functions and activities, the image of the body with its different members.

Brothers and Sisters, we must learn to listen to the Holy Spirit blowing into our lives. Only the Spirit can unlock the doors of our hearts that sometimes refuse to open to peace, to joy, to forgiveness received and given. Let's allow the fire of the Cenacle to burn deep in our hearts and make us new Christians. Let the fire of the Holy Spirit continue to be in our lives and help us to be his missionaries. Let the fire of the Holy Spirit help us to overcome our fears to lead us to preach and announce peace, joy, and forgiveness of God.

Jesus, after his resurrection, said to his apostles, "All power has been given to me in heaven and on earth. So, go to all the nations, make disciples, and baptize them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Teach them to keep all the commandments I have given you. And I am with you every day, until the end of the world" (Matt. 28:19-20). During this week Brothers and Sisters, be the missionary disciples that Jesus wants you to be. Go and exercise what Jesus charges us to do in these verses above.

Faith Formation Registration

We are now registering for St. Teresa's 2023-24 Faith Formation program. Contact the parish office if you are in need of a registration form.

Families can register for the following models.

For Grades K through 7:

Weekly in person classroom session (held in Good Shepherd School). Sundays 9:30-10:45 for grades K through 7th.

Tuesdays 3:30-4:45 for grades 1 through 7th

Home school option for grades 1 through 7. In addition to completing work at home, families commit to attending 6 intergenerational events. Some parent meetings are also required.

For 8th Grade (2nd year Confirmation Prep):

Sessions held 2-3 times per month on Sunday evenings 6:30-8:00. Sessions are in person and will be held in Good Shepherd School or St. John Church.

Please note: Children registering for 2nd or 8th grade MUST have successfully completed year one of their sacramental prep.

We are always in need of catechists and aides to serve our children and keep our program growing and vibrant. Please contact me if you are interested. All volunteers in contact with children must be background checked and attend a Child Abuse Protection Seminar. The parish will reimburse the costs. The Faith Formation fee will be waived for those who volunteer as catechists or aides.

FIRST READING: Acts 2: 1-11

When the time for Pentecost was fulfilled, they were all in one place together. And suddenly there came from the sky a noise like a strong driving wind, and it filled the entire house in which they were. Then there appeared to them tongues as of fire, which parted and came to rest on each one of them. And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in different tongues, as the Spirit enabled them to proclaim. Now there were devout Jews from every nation under heaven staying in Jerusalem. At this sound, they gathered in a large crowd, but they were confused because each one heard them speaking in his own language. They were astounded, and in amazement they asked, "Are not all these people who are speaking Galileans? Then how does each of us hear them in his native language? We are Parthians, Medes, and Elamites, inhabitants of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the districts of Libya near Cyrene, as well as travelers from Rome, both Jews and converts to Judaism, Cretans and Arabs, yet we hear them speaking in our own tongues of the mighty acts of God."

RESPONSORIAL PSALM: Lord, send out your Spirit, and renew the face of the earth.



SECOND READING: 1 Corinthians 12: 3b-7,12-13

Brothers and sisters: No one can say, "Jesus is Lord," except by the Holy Spirit. There are different kinds of spiritual gifts but the same Spirit; there are different forms of service but the same Lord; there are different workings but the same God who produces all of them in everyone. To each individual the manifestation of the Spirit is given for some benefit. As a body is one though it has many parts, and all the parts of the body, though many, are one body, so also Christ. For in one Spirit we were all baptized into one body, whether Jews or Greeks, slaves or free persons, and we were all given to drink of one Spirit.

SEQUENCE: Come, Holy Spirit, come! And from your celestial home, Shed a ray of light divine! Come, O Father of the poor! Come, source of all our store! Come, within our bosoms shine. You, of comforters the best; You, the soul's most welcome guest; Sweet refreshment here below; In our labor, rest most sweet; Grateful coolness in the heat; Solace in the midst of woe. O most blessed Light divine, Shine within these hearts of yours, And our inmost being fill! Where you are not, we have naught, Nothing good in deed or thought, Nothing free from taint of ill. Heal our wounds, our strength renew; On our dryness pour your dew; Wash the stains of guilt away: Bend the stubborn heart and will; Melt the frozen, warm the chill; Guide the steps that go astray. On the faithful, who adore And confess you, evermore In your seven-fold gift descend; Give them virtue's sure reward; Give them your salvation, Lord; Give them joys that never end. Amen. Alleluia.

GOSPEL: John 20: 19-23

On the evening of that first day of the week, when the doors were locked, where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood in their midst and said to them, "Peace be with you." When he had said this, he showed them his hands and his side. The disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you." And when he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained."

At the words that follow, up to and including “and became man”, all bow.

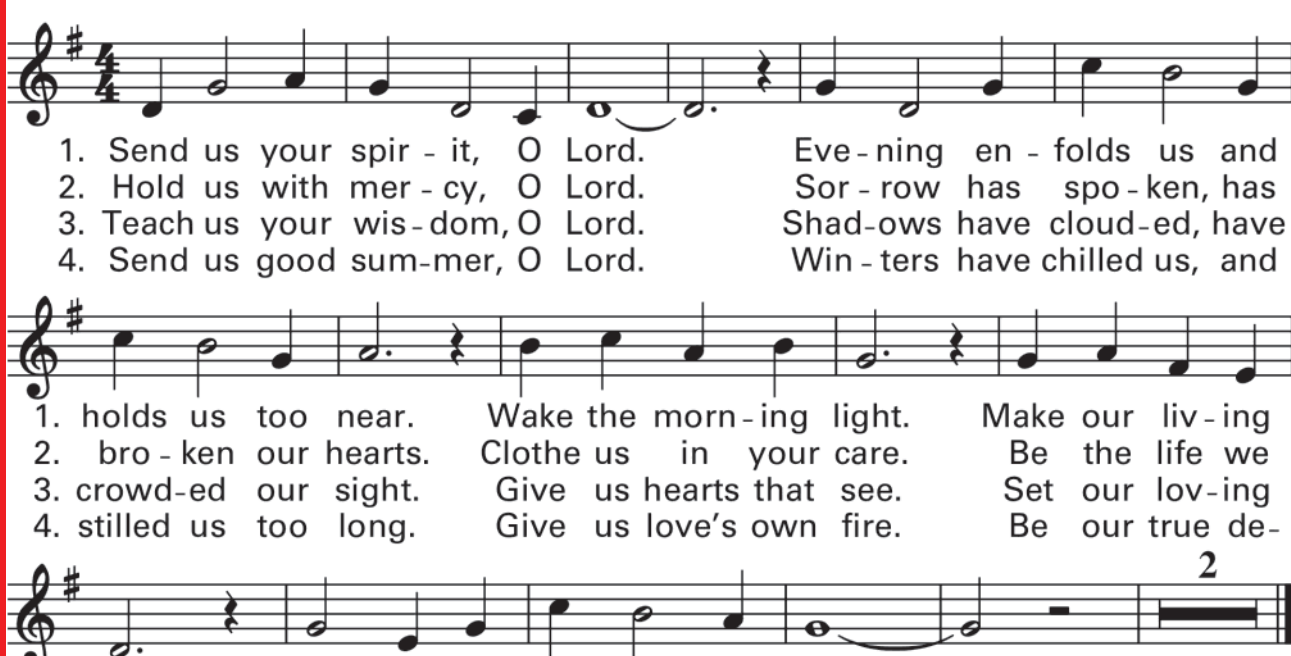
And by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man.

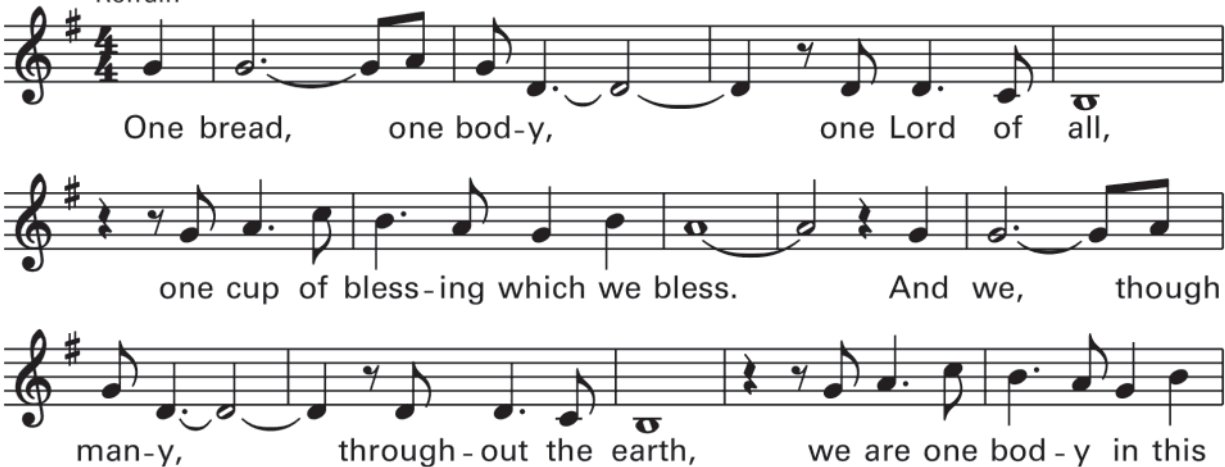

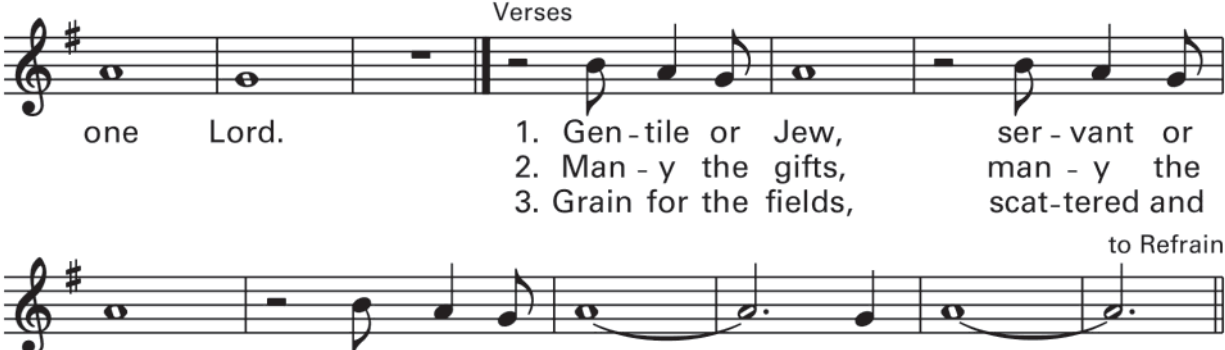
