Registration: We invite all parishioners to register with the Parish. Registration helps us to serve you when issuing letters in connection with sponsorship of Baptism, Confirmation or Matrimony, and for letters of reference. Kindly notify the office if your address changes.

Anointing of the Sick: In case of serious illness or advanced age please call the parish office. For hospital cases, contact the hospital Chaplain.

Pastoral Care: Please call the parish office to have Communion brought to an ill or homebound family member.

Marriage: Couples contemplating marriage in the parish must contact the parish office to meet with a priest to begin the marriage preparation process. This is the first step in planning their wedding and needs to be done one year before the date of the wedding.

Baptisms: To arrange a Baptism, contact the Parish Office at least two weeks before the desired date of Baptism to make arrangements. Parents are required to attend a preparation class before the Baptism. Classes will be held at 7PM (Date will be given when you call). Please call the office to register.

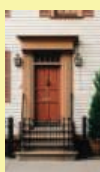

Feast Day of the Week: The Most Holy Name of the Blessed Virgin Mary (Sept. 12)

The Feast of the Most Holy Name of the Blessed Virgin Mary has its origins in Spain. The name "Mary" holds special significance manifested in four aspects. Firstly, it's a name of honor, acknowledging her role as the Mother of God and Jesus' divine origin (the Theotokos). Secondly, it's a most holy name, signifying her grace and favor with God. Lastly, it symbolizes a mother who aids, protects, and prays for all in their times of need. The feast's date, September 12th, is significant due to the 1683 Battle of Vienna, where King Jan Sobieski's Christian forces, seeking Mary's intercession, triumphed over Muslim Turks, securing Christian Europe. This victory prompted Pope Innocent XI to declare the day a celebration of Mary's intercession.

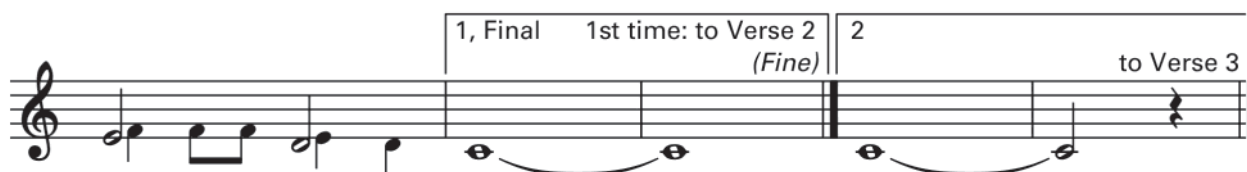
