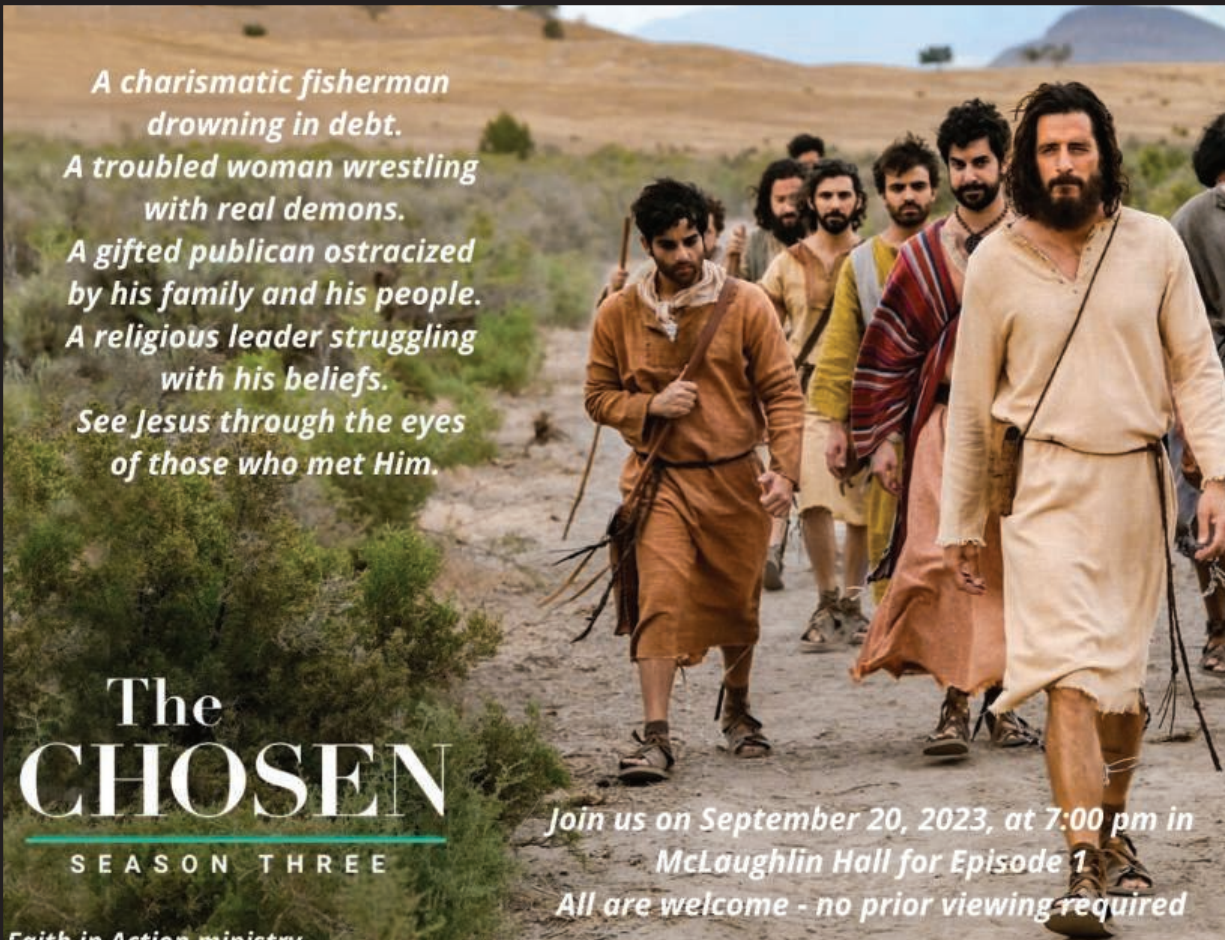

Baptisms: To arrange a Baptism, contact the Parish Office at least two weeks before the desired date of Baptism to make arrangements. Parents are required to attend a preparation class before the Baptism. Classes will be held at 7PM (Date will be given when you call). Please call the office to register.

Come spend some quiet time with the Lord during the day.

Just how merciful does Jesus want us to be? From the Gospel: a man owes the king a huge amount. If we consider the original Gospel before translation, he has to pay back 10,000 talents. So, 1 talent = 6,000 Denarii, and 1 Denarii is the same as a single day's wage. So, the amount this man owes the king is $10,000 \times 6,000 = 60,000,000$ days wages. The answer is; yes, a huge amount, an amount that is clearly impossible to pay back.

This guy begs the king for leniency and the king to his surprise says, "You know what? You are forgiven!" Imagine owing someone just \$60,000,000 dollars which is far less than 60,000,000 days' wages. It is an impossible amount that would take over 160,000 years to pay back!!! But the king forgave him!!!

Now the amount owed the servant by his fellow servant is 100 Denarii, which is still a big amount. This is about 100 days' wages which is a little less than the earnings for one-third of a year. But the servant takes his fellow servant and chokes him and has him thrown into prison.

When the king gets word of what has happened, he calls in that servant whose debt he forgave and throws him in prison for not showing any mercy. This servant wouldn't even give his fellow servant more time to pay. He wanted the money right now, no mercy at all!

The main point is at the end of the parable: If we do not show mercy to others and love them from our heart, God will have no mercy for us! Mercy helps us to be closer to God because love and mercy are all that He is. The example of His Son, Jesus, merciful to all people, people he knew, people he did not know, people who let him down like Peter during the Passion, people who hated him and killed him on the cross. Mercy to all; good and bad. Not easy, but true happiness follows if we can do this!

Imagine going to the best restaurant in town and you forget your wallet. So, you're panicking, "God please help me get out of this!" And the owner says to your surprise, "It's all right, I got you" and he tells you that you are always welcome and next time bring all your friends.

Now imagine that your very own brother is always stiffing you on the bill whenever you go out with him. You take him out again and he is up to his old tricks. Anger starts to build. Hey, this is not fair. Why can't he pick up the check just once? This could lead to a slippery slope.

In anger, you start thinking everybody is like this also. What follows is prejudice; you assume people will always take advantage of you. Fear comes into the picture also because you are thinking crazy things! This is opening the door for sin. And what is sin? Thinking more and more about only yourself and not getting ripped off. Mercy has no place here because in your mind you have been ripped off one too many times. What would the owner of that fancy restaurant think about you if he knew, and you are always going back for your free meal and taking all your friends?

Look at what Jesus is teaching us. You've been forgiven; you are always welcome to be with Him. Or if you don't think you have done anything to be forgiven for, think of this, God really likes you and He is going to help you in all that you do.

Like a really good charismatic friend, you want to show God thankfulness. So now you start looking at people differently. You want to do for them just a little bit of what God did for you. God's going to help you in all that you do, so what do you care?

But you start thinking differently, feeling a little different. You find you kind of like doing nice things for others. Happiness for the most part begins to settle in because you are moving in positive energy. You feel God is looking out for you, and you are looking out for all people you know and always looking for more.

Just like sin is a pathway to selfishness, thankfulness and mercy are the pathway to selflessness. There is no illusion here. You are right with God and know He will never let you down. Things may not always go as expected, but with faith you just keep on going. Not like sin, a big illusion: anger, fear, vengeance and in the end even the owner of that fancy restaurant finds out how you are. Only bad things will come from sin.

Today, reflect on all the things God has given you. Think about the positive; know He will also take care of all the negative in His own way. Don't worry about them, but simply trust in Him. Realize you have been here before, and He has always come through, rarely how you expect, but He always comes through. Just be thankful, remember fear and worry are useless emotions, God moves through positive energy, and through positive energy, He will help you. He always does!

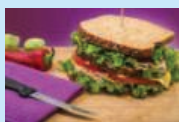

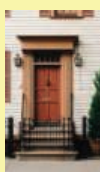

Saint of the Week: Ss. Andre Kim Tae-gon, Paul Chong Ha-Sang & Martyrs

St. Andrew Kim Tae-gon, the first native Korean priest and patron saint of Korea, was martyred along with thousands of Koreans, most of whom were lay people, before Christianity's acceptance in 1884. Over 100 of these martyrs, including Andrew and layman Paul Chong Ha-Sang, are venerated today. The Korean Christian community's origins trace back to the late 1500s when Japanese soldiers baptized the first believers. Despite hardships and a lack of sacraments, the faith grew, facing severe persecutions from the monarchy between 1791 and 1866. Andrew's family endured persecution, and he was eventually ordained a priest after training in China. Captured at 25 while aiding other missionaries, he was tortured and killed in 1846. Similarly, Paul Chong Ha-sang, born to converts, advocated for the faith, established a diocese, and was martyred after refusing to renounce Christianity. Ss. Andrew Kim Tae-gon, Paul Chong Hasang, and the martyrs who died for the faith in Korea, pray for us!

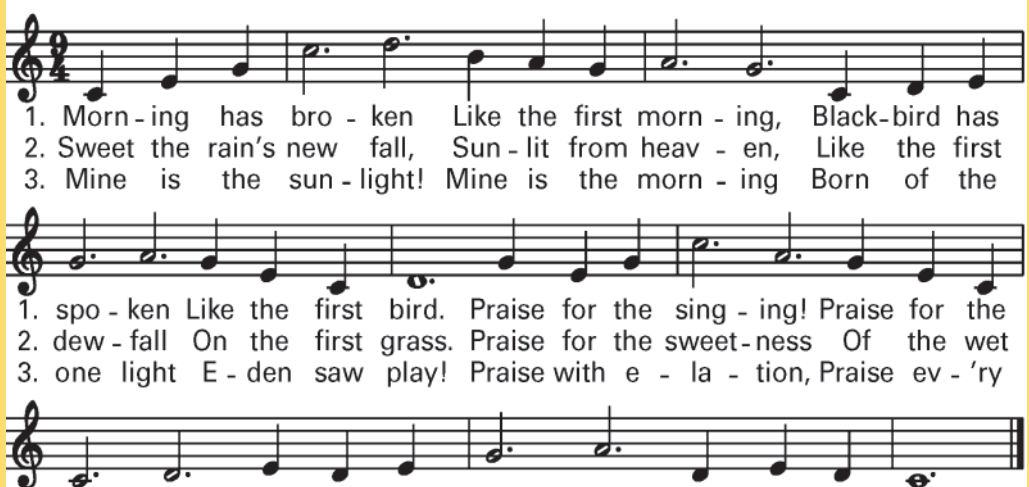

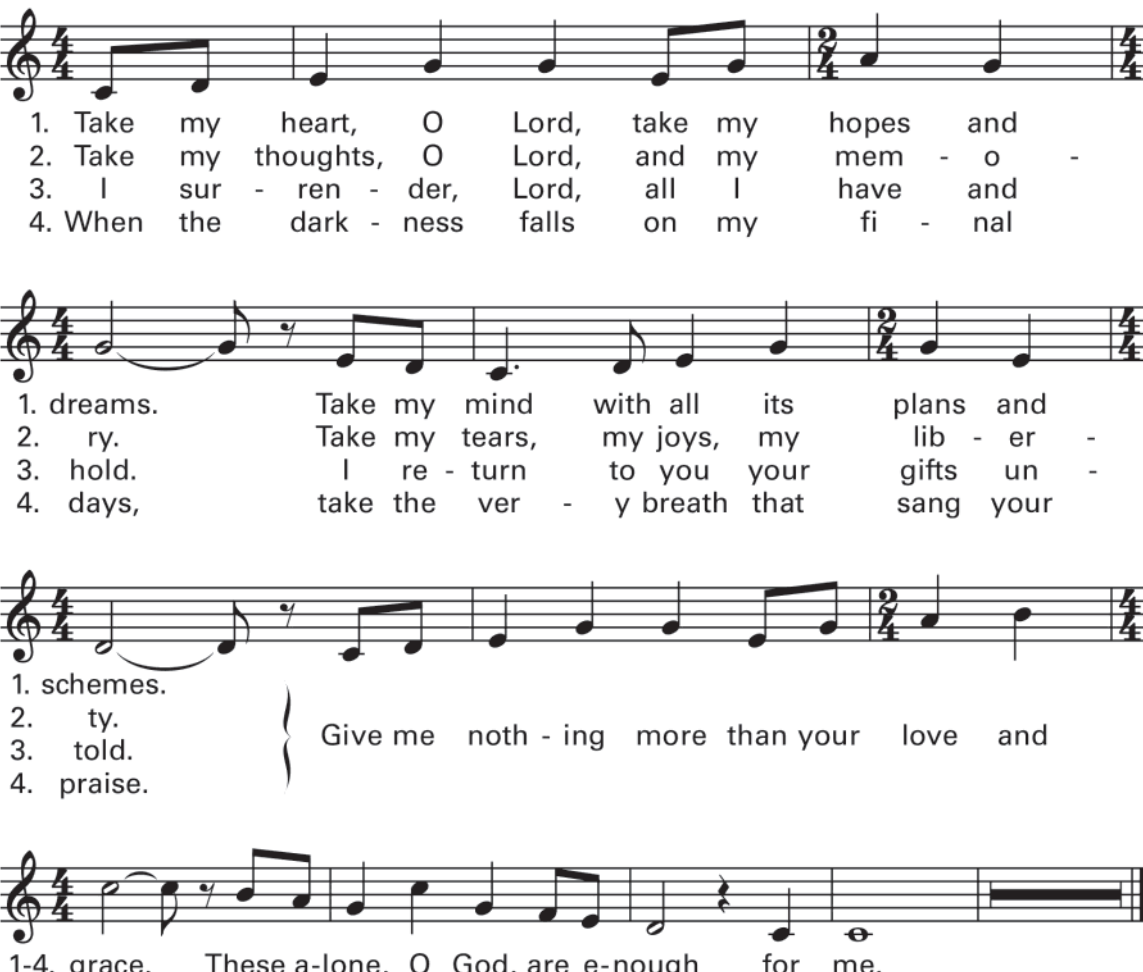
GOSPEL: Matthew 18: 21-35

Peter approached Jesus and asked him, "Lord, if my brother sins against me, how often must I forgive? As many as seven times?" Jesus answered, "I say to you, not seven times but seventy-seven times. That is why the kingdom of heaven may be likened to a king who decided to settle accounts with his servants. When he began the accounting, a debtor was brought before him who owed him a huge amount. Since he had no way of paying it back, his master ordered him to be sold, along with his wife, his children, and all his property, in payment of the debt. At that, the servant fell down, did him homage, and said, 'Be patient with me, and I will pay you back in full.' Moved with compassion the master of that servant let him go and forgave him the loan. When that servant had left, he found one of his fellow servants who owed him a much smaller amount. He seized him and started to choke him, demanding, 'Pay back what you owe.' Falling to his knees, his fellow servant begged him, 'Be patient with me, and I will pay you back.' But he refused. Instead, he had the fellow servant put in prison until he paid back the debt. Now when his fellow servants saw what had happened, they were deeply disturbed, and went to their master and reported the whole affair. His master summoned him and said to him, 'You wicked servant! I forgave you your entire debt because you begged me to. Should you not have had pity on your fellow servant, as I had pity on you?' Then in anger his master handed him over to the torturers until he should pay back the whole debt. So will my heavenly Father do to you, unless each of you forgives your brother from your heart."

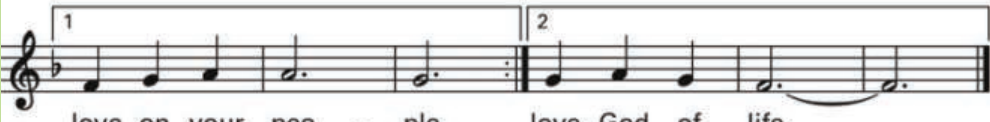
