Anointing of the Sick: In case of serious illness or advanced age please call the parish office. For hospital cases, contact the hospital Chaplain.

Pastoral Care: Please call the parish office to have Communion brought to an ill or homebound family member.

Marriage: Couples contemplating marriage in the parish must contact the parish office to meet with a priest to begin the marriage preparation process. This is the first step in planning their wedding and needs to be done one year before the date of the wedding.

Baptisms: To arrange a Baptism, contact the Parish Office at least two weeks before the desired date of Baptism to make arrangements. Parents are required to attend a preparation class before the Baptism. Classes will be held at 7PM (Date will be given when you call). Please call the office to register.

We reached Our South Jersey Ministry Appeal Goal

I want to use this opportunity to thank you all for helping us to reach our goal for this year of South Jersey Ministry Appeal. The theme this year for the South Jersey Appeal is “For the Life of the World.” As a parish, we proved that we care about others and care about our mission and the mission of our Patroness, Saint Teresa of Calcutta who cared so much for those in need. So many of you have gone above and beyond to pray and to support this appeal which is good not only for our parish but for the people in our diocese.

The beautiful part of the appeal is the formation of our Seminarians. Remember I was once a seminarian and your sacrificial donation to the Appeal has helped pay for my formation. As you know I am forever grateful to each one of you who contributed to this beautiful cause. I am certain that Jesus will continue to provide for you and for your family so that you can continue to provide for others. This is a way for us as parishioners to minister to our brothers and sister to respond to the gospel of Matthew, “Whenever you did it to one of the least of these, who are my brothers, you did it to me! (Matthew 25, 40)

These words are at the heart of the Gospel and the Lord will repeat them to us for the final examination of our life. Every day we prepare ourselves for this final judgement. No doubt we are trying our best in every way we can to be faithful to the Lord so that when that time comes so will be ready to answer these following questions: Did we give food and drink to those who were hungry and thirsty? Welcome foreigners? Clothe our brothers and sisters who have no clothes? Visit the sick or prisoners? Small gestures certainly, but they have the flavor of eternity. Nothing is small when done out of love. Not only was it not enough for Jesus to be close to the poor and the marginalized, nor to heal the sick, He loved them with a special love. He went so far as to call them His brothers, to the point of identifying with them in a mysterious solidarity. Even today, Jesus is present in those who suffer injustice and violence, unemployment, and insecurity, and those who are forced by war to leave their country. We also have many who are suffering around us and waiting, in silence, for our help! They are Jesus, who asks us for a concrete love, a love which invents new “works of mercy.”

If helping an elderly person or a sick person is helping Jesus, how could I not help Him? If I teach the language of my country to an immigrant child, I teach it to Jesus. If I come to help a mother with the housework, it is Jesus I’m helping. If I bring hope to a prisoner, if I console someone who is crying, if I forgive someone who hurt me, it is to Jesus that I do it. Each time, it will give joy not only to the other, but to us too, an even greater joy. When we give, we receive. We are happy because, even if we do not realize it, we have met Jesus. As Chiara Lubich wrote, the ‘other’ is the “vault” under which we must pass to reach God.

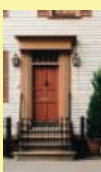

Saint of the Week: Ss. Cosmos & Damian (Sept. 26)

The Church celebrates Saints Cosmas and Damian, twin brothers, physicians, and martyrs whose lives remain shrouded in historical uncertainty but have inspired widespread veneration in Christian traditions since ancient times. Born, perhaps in Syria, in the third century, they were raised as Christians and trained as skilled physicians. Their notable practice of providing free medical care to their community, defying the norm of paid medical services, earned them the name "Anargyroi" or "without silver." Their compassionate outreach led many to embrace Christianity. However, in the midst of Emperor Diocletian's empire-wide Christian persecution, they were arrested, steadfastly refused to renounce their faith, and endured miraculous protection from various execution attempts. Ultimately, they were killed, and their remains were laid to rest in Cyrrhus. The legacy of Saints Cosmas and Damian is one of selfless service, unwavering faith, and miraculous intercession in times of illness.
