For this week's reflection, let us focus on the Second Reading from Saint Paul. Have no anxiety at all! Saint Paul reminds me of a very funny comedian whom I thought was classic, the late great Bob Newhart.

He did a skit once where he was a psychologist, very dry and matter of fact, and when he was helping people with the most serious of problems would simply tell them, "Stop doing it." Saint Paul is telling us the same thing: "Have no anxiety at all;" but Saint Paul is not joking around. He is serious. And as he is telling us this we would have really been annoyed if he was living in a beautiful mansion, with millions of dollars and countless servants, but he is not. He was in jail! Rather than worrying about what kind of horrific death was coming his way, he writes a letter to his friends in Philippi.

My first thought is that he is crazy! How can he not worry about his future, with so many horrible ways to die? But Saint Paul remembered something Jesus said that is very simple directly from the Sermon on the Mount. "...do not be anxious about your life, what you shall eat or what you shall drink, nor about your body, what you shall put on. Look at the birds of the air: they neither sow nor reap nor gather into barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not of more value than they?"

My favorite line from this Second Reading is when Paul tells the people of Philippi to keep doing what they had learned and received and heard not just from Jesus but from his own life. Paul tells them to be just like him. That is as good as being just like Jesus. Paul was so closely linked to Jesus he did not see a difference whether the people follow Jesus or himself. Wow! Anybody else we would have thought they were completely wrapped up in themselves, so delusional they must be crazy. I wonder if Saint Paul had a sense of humor like Bob Newhart. Maybe.

But Paul is different. Through the grace of God and through the same Spirit as Jesus, he is telling us to put what Jesus said into action. He was tapped into something that Peter had tapped into when he was walking on the water. For a few seconds Peter was walking on water; it is possible, but fear and worry took that amazing moment away from him.

That is what fear and worry do to us. They take amazing moments that could have happened away from us. They rob us of so many wonderful things because we are simply too scared to do them. Fear and worry have no real impact on our lives anyway. Fear and worry are centered on us remembering painful past events or centered around dwelling on bad consequences that could happen in the future, if we act in a certain way. The key word is "if". When we start playing "what if" games, trust in Jesus is replaced with trust in those consequences possibly coming to be.

Saint Paul, as bold as he was with his Bob Newhart advice, also gives us the key for this to become reality! It is very simple: prayer, going to God and trusting in Him. Asking Him for help and remembering all the times in the past He was there and saved you.

Many people pray and ask God for help and that is it, but prayer works as Saint Paul tells us in two ways. One, talking to God as you would your best friend and asking for His help, trusting in Him, quietly listening to Him. And he does respond, very subtly; always in a whisper so you have to calm down or you will miss it completely. And two, remembering the many times Jesus saved us in the past. This thankfulness reminds us that Jesus is always there, always has been and always will be. Fear and anxiety have no place in our lives. Faith, and hope in Him are all that remain, and they are all that we need.

If we can do this right, we, unlike Peter, can walk for miles with Jesus on the water because fear and worry are no longer present just hope and thankfulness in Jesus.

Saint of the Week: St. John Henry Newman (October 9th)

John Henry Newman, born in London, England, was the eldest of three sons in a family with a banking background and engraving-papermaking roots. Early on, he absorbed religious knowledge from his Anglican mother, gaining familiarity with the Bible. His intense passion for reading, spanning from Arabian tales to philosophical works, started during his years at Great Ealing School. At age fifteen, a significant conversion occurred as he embraced Evangelical beliefs and subsequently immersed himself in theological study at Trinity College, Oxford. Newman's journey included ordainment in the Anglican Church, pastoral roles, and a pivotal association with the Oxford Movement. However, his deep exploration of Church Fathers led him to convert to Roman Catholicism in 1845. In subsequent years, he made significant contributions to Catholic education, theology, and literature, embodying the pursuit of truth despite societal expectations. Cardinal Newman's legacy encourages relentless pursuit of truth and personal transformation, emphasizing the importance of following one's faith convictions. Source:Franciscanmedia

FIRST READING: Isaiah 5: 1-7

Let me now sing of my friend, my friend's song concerning his vineyard. My friend had a vineyard on a fertile hillside; he spaded it, cleared it of stones, and planted the choicest vines; within it he built a watchtower, and hewed out a wine press. Then he looked for the crop of grapes, but what it yielded was wild grapes. Now, inhabitants of Jerusalem and people of Judah, judge between me and my vineyard: What more was there to do for my vineyard that I had not done? Why, when I looked for the crop of grapes, did it bring forth wild grapes? Now, I will let you know what I mean to do with my vineyard: take away its hedge, give it to grazing, break through its wall, let it be trampled! GOSPEL:

Jesus said to the chief priests and the elders of the people: "Hear another parable. There was a landowner who planted a vineyard, put a hedge around it, dug a wine press in it, and built a tower. Then he leased it to tenants and went on a journey. When vintage time drew near, he sent his servants to the tenants to obtain his produce. But the tenants seized the servants and one they beat, another they killed, and a third they stoned. Again he sent other servants, more numerous than the first ones, but they treated them in the same way. Finally, he sent his son to them, thinking, 'They will respect my son.' But when the tenants saw the son, they said to one another, 'This is the heir. Come, let us kill him and acquire his inheritance.' They seized him, threw him out of the vineyard, and killed him. What will the owner of the vineyard do to those tenants when he comes?" They answered him, "He will put those wretched men to a wretched death and lease his vineyard to other tenants who will give him the produce at the proper times." Jesus said to them, "Did you never read in the Scriptures: *The stone that the builders rejected has become the cornerstone; by the Lord has this been done, and it is wonderful in our eyes?* Therefore, I say to you, the kingdom of God will be taken away from you and given to a people that will produce its fruit."

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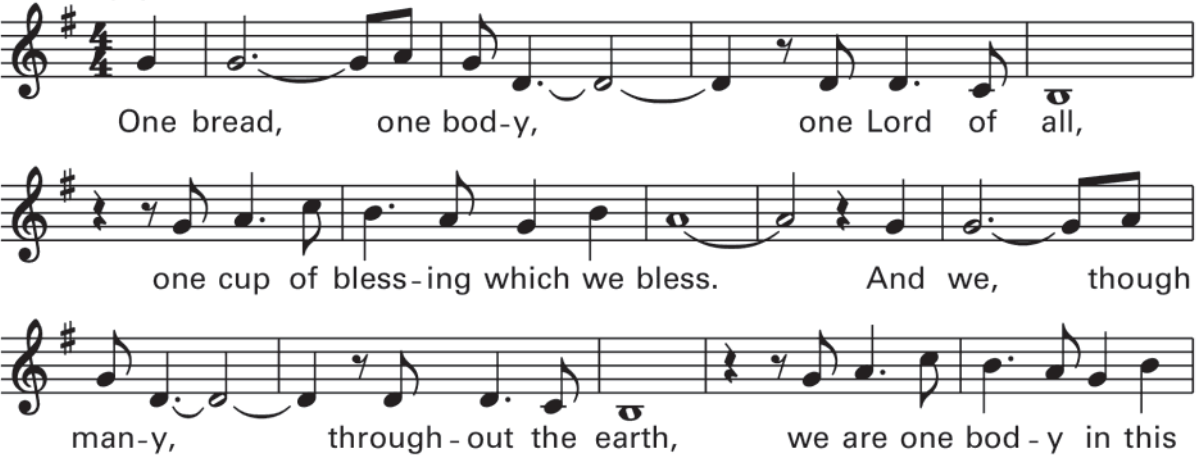

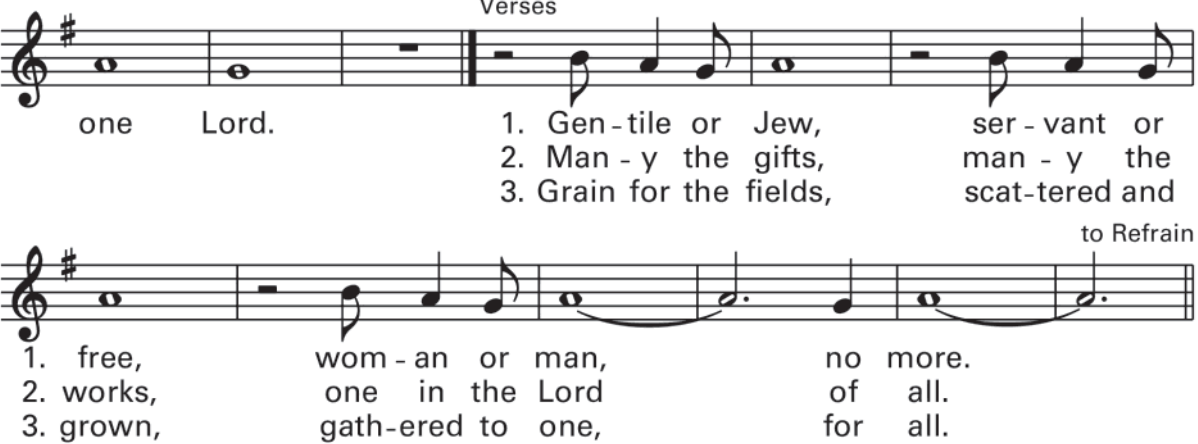
