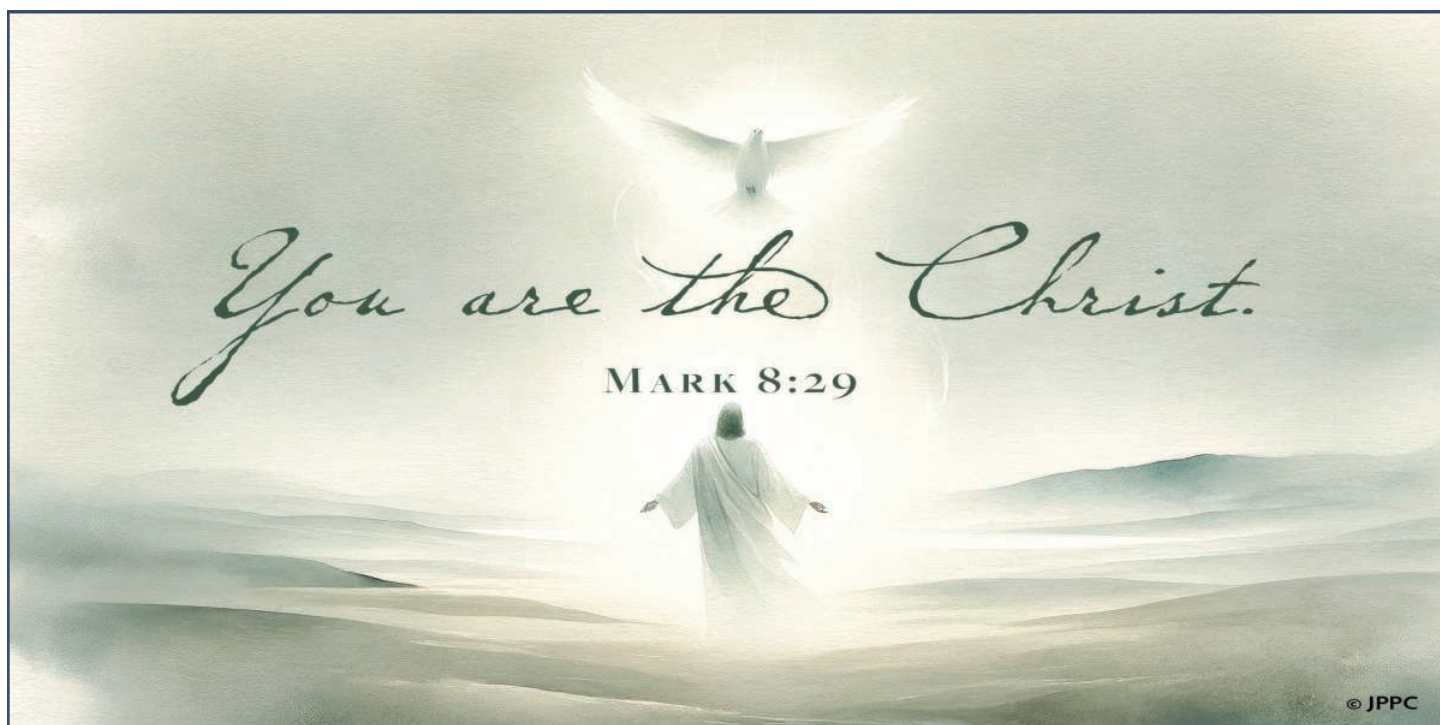

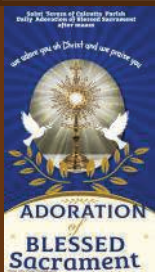

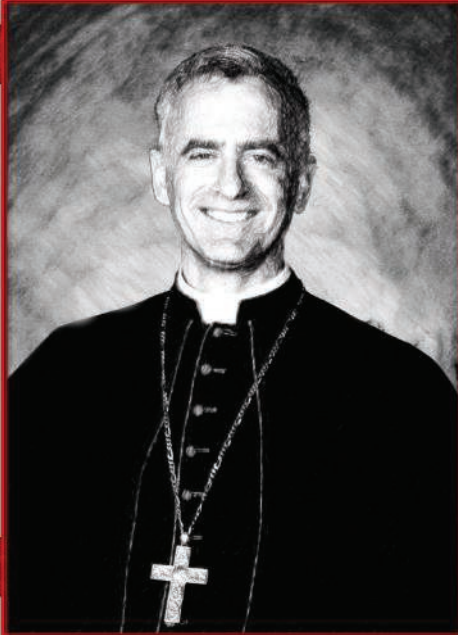

St. Cornelius

Feast Day: September 16th

Patron of Earaches, Domestic animals, Cattle,
Epilepsy, Fever, and Twitching

After the martyrdom of Saint Fabian, the Church was without a pope for 14 months due to intense persecution. During this period, it was governed by a college of priests. Cornelius was eventually elected pope with widespread support. His papacy, lasting two years, focused on the issue of reconciling Christians who had denied their faith during persecution. Cornelius opposed Novatian, an antipope, who refused to allow such Christians to return to the Church. A synod in 251 upheld Cornelius's stance, allowing the "relapsed" to be reconciled through penance. Cornelius died in exile, and his papacy demonstrated the growing organization of the Church in Rome.



The theme for 2024 is "Lord, when did we see you hungry?" (Matthew 25:37). This theme highlights our call to missionary discipleship. As St John Paul II reminded us: Every member of the faithful is called to holiness and to mission. We are called to be Eucharist by word and action to our brothers and sisters in Christ. Our times cry out for this kind of holiness, one inflamed by the ardent determination to bring as many of our brothers and sisters as possible to Christ.

Saint Ludovico of Casoria Ludovico was an Italian Franciscan friar, who dedicated his life to the vulnerable; established a dispensary for the poor, two schools for African children, an institute for the children of nobility, as well as an institution for orphans, the deaf, and the speechless, and other institutes for the blind, elderly, and for travelers.

To help continue these works of mercy, in 1859 he established the Gray Brothers, a religious community composed of men who formerly belonged to the Secular Franciscan Order. Three years later, he founded the Gray Sisters of St. Elizabeth for the same purpose. His love for Christ moved him to great acts of charity.

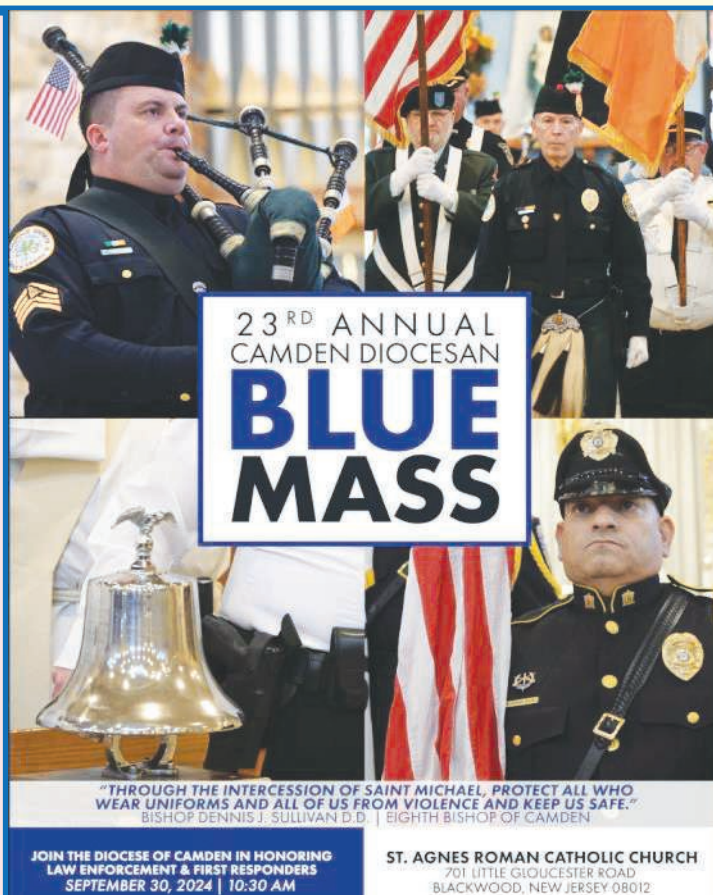

FIRST READING: [Is 50:5-9a](#)

The Lord GOD opens my ear that I may hear; and I have not rebelled, have not turned back. I gave my back to those who beat me, my cheeks to those who plucked my beard; my face I did not shield from buffets and spitting. The Lord GOD is my help, therefore I am not disgraced; I have set my face like flint, knowing that I shall not be put to shame. He is near who upholds my right; if anyone wishes to oppose me, let us appear together. Who disputes my right? Let that man confront me. See, the Lord GOD is my help; who will prove me wrong?

RESPONSORIAL PSALM: [Ps 116:1-2, 3-4, 5-6, 8-9](#) I will walk before the Lord, in the land of the living.

SECOND READING: [Jas 2:14-18](#)

What good is it, my brothers and sisters, if someone says he has faith but does not have works? Can that faith save him? If a brother or sister has nothing to wear and has no food for the day, and one of you says to them, "Go in peace, keep warm, and eat well, " but you do not give them the necessities of the body, what good is it? So also faith of itself, if it does not have works, is dead.

Indeed someone might say, "You have faith and I have works." Demonstrate your faith to me without works, and I will demonstrate my faith to you from my works.

GOSPEL: [Mk 8:27-35](#)

Jesus and his disciples set out for the villages of Caesarea Philippi. Along the way he asked his disciples, "Who do people say that I am?" They said in reply, "John the Baptist, others Elijah, still others one of the prophets." And he asked them, "But who do you say that I am?" Peter said to him in reply, "You are the Christ." Then he warned them not to tell anyone about him.

He began to teach them that the Son of Man must suffer greatly and be rejected by the elders, the chief priests, and the scribes, and be killed, and rise after three days. He spoke this openly. Then Peter took him aside and began to rebuke him. At this he turned around and, looking at his disciples, rebuked Peter and said, "Get behind me, Satan. You are thinking not as God does, but as human beings do."

He summoned the crowd with his disciples and said to them, "Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me. For whoever wishes to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for my sake and that of the gospel will save it.",

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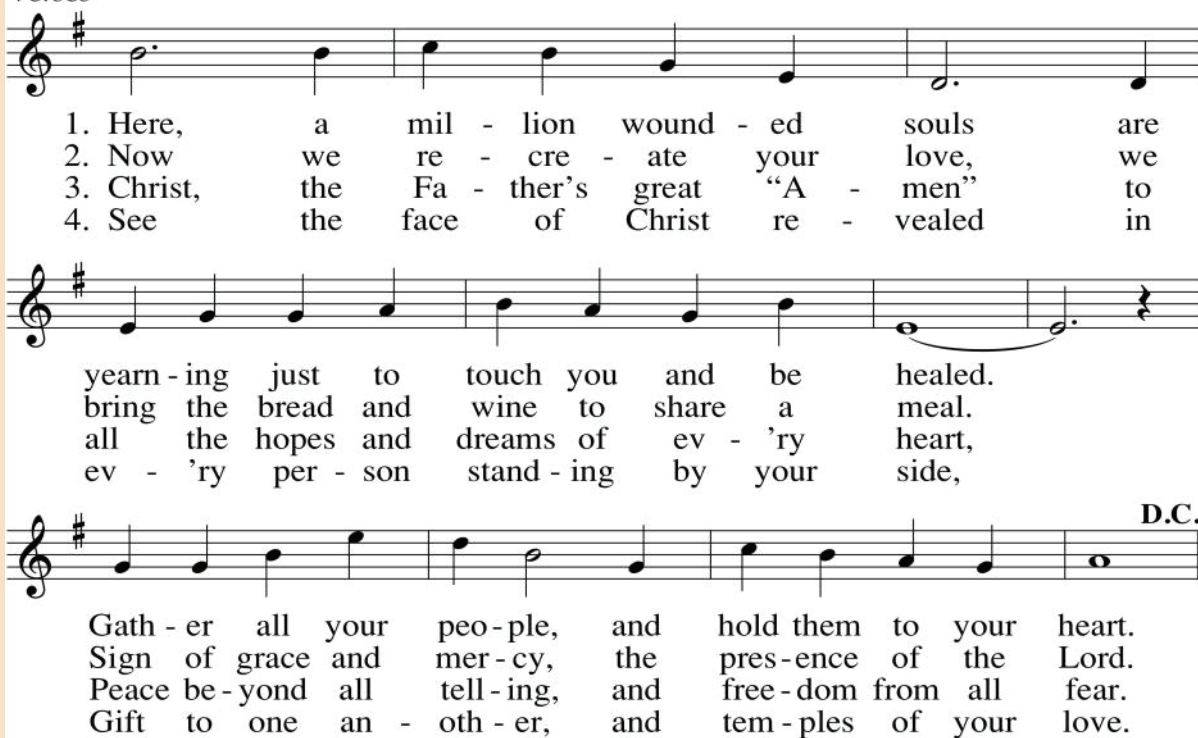
