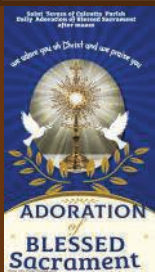

REFLECTION

The Gospel today talks about how we want to be great and desire more. There is some good in "competition" in industry where we can encourage one another to be better, versus for us to be seeking our own glory at the cost of others and wanting to step on anyone to get to the top, instead of being poor in spirit, humble, supportive and kind.

Does our jealousy and selfish ambition control our thinking and permeate into how we perform our jobs? If we are only seeking our own selfish ambitions, it can lead to fights and wars. It blinds us to the needs of others and makes us unable to associate with the lowly.

St. Teresa of Calcutta said this in speaking to her Sisters about how we can grow in the attitude of humility and service: "Contemplation is impossible...without a sharing in the passion of Christ, in the suffering of the poorest of the poor. We must give up sin, our past self indulgence, and practice more intense self sacrificing love for Him."

May our sharing in the Eucharistic sacrifice teach us to seek the wisdom from above rather than the wisdom of the world. Scripture tell us (Jas 3:16) that the wisdom from above is pure and full of mercy and good fruits that can bring true peace.

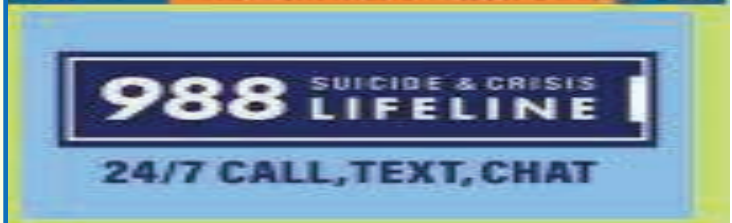

The wicked say: Let us beset the just one, because he is obnoxious to us; he sets himself against our doings, reproaches us for transgressions of the law and charges us with violations of our training. Let us see whether his words be true; let us find out what will happen to him. For if the just one be the son of God, God will defend him and deliver him from the hand of his foes. With revilement and torture let us put the just one to the test that we may have proof of his gentleness and try his patience. Let us condemn him to a shameful death; for according to his own words, God will take care of him.

Beloved: Where jealousy and selfish ambition exist, there is disorder and every foul practice. But they did not understand the saying, and they were afraid to question him.

They came to Capernaum and, once inside the house, he began to ask them, "What were you arguing about on the way?" But they remained silent. They had been discussing among themselves on the way who was the greatest. Then he sat down, called the Twelve, and said to them, "If anyone wishes to be first, he shall be the last of all and the servant of all." Taking a child, he placed it in their midst, and putting his arms around it, he said to them, "Whoever receives one child such as this in my name, receives me; and whoever receives me, receives not me but the One who sent me."
