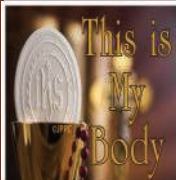

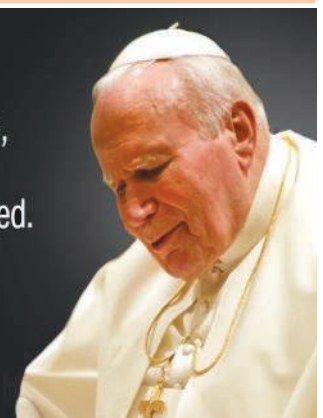

Twenty-Ninth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Reflection by Pastor Steven Bertonazzi

On a Sunday during my first year in seminary, this Sunday's Scriptures were the readings of the day. I remember our Rector, the priest in charge of the seminary, giving a talk on that Sunday night and referring to the first reading. He reflected on the line, "Pick out certain men, and tomorrow go out and engage Amalek in battle." Our rector was making the point that priests are the men who the Lord picks out to engage in battle. Amalek is a historical figure who represents those people who are opposed to God and His people. As the New Israel, the Church is the people of God and anything opposed to God is opposed to us, just as Amalek was opposed to the Israelites.

God has picked out certain men to continue to lead the New People of the Church and to fight against the forces opposed to God and His people. This battle never ends on this side of heaven. That is why we need to be persevering in prayer, just as Moses was for His people. The way Moses held his hands up in prayer to God, Jesus held His hands up on the cross interceding for us in our battle against sin. And now priests, who are in Persona Christi, in the Person of Christ, hold their hands up during Mass to intercede for God's people in the continuing battle against sin. When we are at Mass, the people offer all of their prayers up with the priest, in the one true sacrifice of Christ to the Father who always hears our prayers. We need to persevere in coming to Mass each Sunday with faith in the One who wants us to pray to Him. If we offer our prayers in trust to the One who has already conquered sin, then we will be victorious along with Him and will gain the Promised Land of heaven.

I needed to hear that talk from my rector to believe that the Lord was truly calling me to the vocation of priesthood, and more young men today need to be encouraged to answer the call of the Lord. It is a long journey for all of us in whatever vocation the Lord is calling us to do. But we can persevere with faith because the Lord has told us that He will secure justice for us and He is trustworthy. But when the Son of Man comes, will He find faith on earth?

Twenty-Ninth Sunday in Ordinary Time - Year C

FIRST READING:

Exodus 17:8-13

In those days, Amalek came and waged war against Israel. Moses, therefore, said to Joshua, "Pick out certain men, and tomorrow go out and engage Amalek in battle. I will be standing on top of the hill with the staff of God in my hand." So Joshua did as Moses told him: he engaged Amalek in battle after Moses had climbed to the top of the hill with Aaron and Hur. As long as Moses kept his hands raised up, Israel had the better of the fight, but when he let his hands rest, Amalek had the better of the fight. Moses' hands, however, grew tired; so they put a rock in place for him to sit on. Meanwhile Aaron and Hur supported his hands, one on one side and one on the other, so that his hands remained steady till sunset. And Joshua mowed down Amalek and his people with the edge of the sword.

SECOND READING:

2 Timothy 3:14-4:2

Beloved: Remain faithful to what you have learned and believed, because you know from whom you learned it, and that from infancy you have known the sacred Scriptures, which are capable of giving you wisdom for salvation through faith in Christ Jesus. All Scripture is inspired by God and is useful for teaching, for refutation, for correction, and for training in righteousness, so that one who belongs to God may be competent, equipped for every good work. Jesus told his disciples a parable about the necessity for them to pray always without becoming weary. He said, "There was a judge in a certain town who neither feared God nor respected any human being. And a widow in that town used to come to him and say, 'Render a just decision for me against my adversary.' For a long time the judge was unwilling, but eventually he thought, 'While it is true that I neither fear God nor respect any human being, because this widow keeps bothering me I shall deliver a just decision for her lest she finally come and strike me.'" The Lord said, "Pay attention to what the dishonest judge says. Will not God then secure the rights of his chosen ones who call out to him day and night? Will he be slow to answer them? I tell you, he will see to it that justice is done for them speedily. But when the Son of Man comes, will he find faith on earth?"
